Yes, we hear familiar stories during the Season of Advent. We think of the well-known themes of hope, peace, joy, and love. But our lives are not exactly the same year after year. The changes we experience may just change how we understand those old stories, somehow made new in our retelling. What might this holy season of Advent have in store for you to discover?
