A Note From Pastor Lauren

Heaven is declaring God's glory; the sky is proclaiming [God's] handiwork. One day gushes the news to the next, and one night informs another what needs to be known.

Of course, there's no speech, no words—
their voices can't be heard—
but their sound extends throughout the
world;

their words reach the ends of the earth. ~Psalm 19:1-4, *CEB*

The first day of spring (the vernal equinox) is March 19th this year according to *The Old Farmer's Almanac*—right on the horizon. I often associate Easter with the start of spring. Even though Easter is quite early this year (March 31st), we can't complain *too much* that spring hasn't arrived by the time we celebrate! Spring will indeed have sprung by the time we gather for Holy Week and Easter services at the end of March.

We remember that seasons come and go. And we can appreciate the beauty of the various seasons we experience here in Connecticut. Throughout Lent we have been (and will be) praying the Psalms together in worship during the Call to Worship. One reason I love the Psalms is because they draw upon images from the

natural world. The beauty of God's good creation is highlighted in the Psalms in moving ways, and the Psalms feel real as we move through our lives.

Take Psalm 19 (the Psalm designated as the Lectionary Psalm for March 3rd), and just listen to the pure poetry. Read it aloud and hear how moving the Psalmist talks about God and the natural world.

Heaven is declaring the glory of God. The sky proclaims God's handiwork.

Have you ever gazed upon a sunrise or a sunset and felt the presence of God? Have you ever looked outside during the glorious light of morning or the golden hour at the end of the day and thought about how God is with you through all the mountains and valleys of life? The Psalmist declares that God's glory is all around us. Let that thought be a comfort as we move through Lent, Holy Week, and Easter soon to come.
