

#### **Note From Pastor Lauren**

"On Christmas morning we find the manger full of life; on Easter morning we find the tomb empty of death. We know the whole truth now; death is not the end, and life as we know it is only the beginning of Life. There is no suffering from which we cannot rise if we live a life centered in Jesus."

In May, we continue with the Sundays of Easter in worship. Because on Easter morning we found the tomb empty of death. We understood on a deeper level that life as we know it is only the beginning of Life. Hallelujah!

As I shared in my sermon about "Doubting Thomas" on April 16, Easter Sunday ushers in a season called Eastertide. For some reason, we remember and pay much more attention to Lent than to Eastertide in the Christian Church. (There's a whole sermon and/or theological reflection in that statement, but I'm just going to let that observation be for now)!

The point is that Eastertide lasts for 50 days and ends on Pentecost (May 28 this liturgical year). Eastertide is a time

of celebration—the party that began on Easter keeps going. Eastertide is this season in the church where we keep celebrating the Resurrection of Jesus the Christ. Not as a one-off event, but as a lived reality for the followers of Jesus ever since. The Gospel texts we read in the season of Eastertide are some of the stories about Jesus appearing after the Resurrection like appearing to the disciples in the locked room and then to the disciples with Doubting Thomas. Not to mention Jesus appearing to the two disciples on the road to Emmaus.

This season provides the opportunity for us to keep on celebrating the Easter miracle. To celebrate that death never gets the last word in God's story. To celebrate that God keeps God's promises. To ponder some of life's great mysteries that we cannot always understand with our heads but need to feel in our hearts. To celebrate hope everlasting.

From the CWS website: The CWS Blankets program was created "to give a kind, loving and tangible response to someone facing a difficult time, reminding them that they are not alone. Through the generosity of CWS partner organizations, congregations and individual supporters, our most vulnerable neighbors around the world can feel safe and keep warm with fresh linens and clean sleeping quarters."



