## **MESSAGE FROM DEACONS**

As you're probably aware, Colchester Federated Church has faced a large financial shortage this year. We have strived to create new ways to solve old budgetary problems, and as we've faced these problems together, we've been more successful than we assumed we would be at the beginning of the year. However, there is more work to be done!

Several months ago, we sent a survey related to fundraising options, and we were able to get a clear picture of where members were interested in focusing their efforts. The five ideas that received the most votes were a Sit-Down Dinner, a BINGO Night, a Food Truck event, a Goods & Services Auction, and a Pancake/Crepe Breakfast.

Our hope is to hold 1 or 2 (or 3) of these events, and **HERE IS THE MOST IMPORTANT PART: WE NEED YOU! If any of the above ideas appeal to you, and you believe that you can effectively coordinate it, please take it and run with it! Make it your own!** Do you have a super-duper crepe recipe? Excellent – that Pancake/Crepe Breakfast is calling your name! Are you an exceptionally skilled BINGO caller? Then have I got an idea for you! Put that talent to good use and plan a BINGO night! If you're thinking that you couldn't possibly handle an entire fundraising event, we've got you covered! Stewardship has created a "fundraising cheat sheet" to help you with everything you need to know to run a successful fundraiser, and Mark Bosse would be happy to share it with you! (Thanks Mark!)

To give you an idea of what is possible, here's a list of what CFC's dedicated and generous (and awesome!) members have accomplished so far this year, for both our church and our community. We're hoping this serves as inspiration as you consider how **you** can help!

- We collected soup, soup, and more soup for the Colchester Food Bank over 100 cans were donated!
- We made and sold SO VERY many pancakes for the Shrove Tuesday Pancake Dinner and earned \$278 in the process!
- We held a diaper and baby wipe drive for DCF and gave them **1,745 diapers** and **1,592 wipes** for cute babies in our area!
- Our Spring in Bloom Vendor Fair the most successful ever, I'm told raised \$2,516!
- We sold cards and sent \$530 to Church World Service to help them "blanket the world in love"!
- We sold yummy snacks at the Memorial Day parade, which gave us \$78 we didn't have before!
- We donated a bunch of clothes and stuff we weren't going to use anyway 2,741 pounds to be exact to "Savers" and traded them for a cool **\$975!**
- We washed some cars on a really hot day in July, bringing in **\$1,144** for our troubles!
- We hung up 100 envelopes on the wall, called it "The Lord's Laundry", and watched as **\$4,887** fell right into our outstretched hands!
- And... we're in the process of collecting snacks galore for the Colchester Public Schools (three big bins filled so far)!
- On top of all of that, we have several other events on the horizon: a tag sale, another car wash, a fall vendor fair, and our annual Holly Fair which will feature brand new cookie and soup sales. Phew!



#### MEDICAL CLINIC

#### DCDC

Some individuals at CFC support children at the ministry's DCDC (Discipleship Children's Development Center). It may seem strange for most of us to see everyone on the floor. But this is the same environment as the government schools; there are no desks. Support pays for the teacher, the woman in the first photo, and for children's school fees at the government school. Many cannot afford these fees and the children remain uneducated and locked in a cycle of poverty.

## **NOTICE OF SPECIAL MEETING**

WHEREAS, the Ministry of Stewardship, at their regular meeting of August 8, 2023, voted to call a Special Meeting of the Congregation, per Article V., Section 5 of the By-Laws, for September 24, 2023;

NOW THEREFORE, the Members of the Colchester Federated Church are hereby called to meet at a Special Meeting on **September 24, 2023**, immediately following Worship Service, for the following purposes:

1. To approve an amount for the previously authorized Capital Campaign;

2. To hear and act on the proposal of the Ministry of Stewardship to side the front of the Church building;

3. If siding is approved, to hear and act on entering into a contract with John K. Leecock Company to side the front of the Church building and make repairs to the existing siding, in the amount of \$16,185;

4. To hear and act on the proposal of the Ministry of Stewardship to enter into a contract with Valley Restoration Company for repairs to the structure of the main beam, portico and columns of the Church building, in the amount of \$90,225;

5. To hear and act on the report of the Finance Advisory Team as to borrowing necessary funds from the Endowment; and

6. Any other business suitable and proper to come before said meeting.
