PROTECTING YOUTH

"Sextortion is a form of child sexual exploitation where children are manipulated into sending a sexual image or video, then threatened and blackmailed by a person who demands additional sexual content, activity, or money from the child. What begins as an online friendship or romantic relationship quickly changes into a scary and desperate situation for the child. The exploiter has no issue with shaming the child and tearing them down, even to the point of tragically taking their own life.

I learned that once images are shared, young people may be too scared to come and tell an adult and feel there is no way out. Open conversations with young people – as young as 10-12 years old – can prevent this harm from happening. They can learn what signs to look for, they can be assured we are always there for them, no matter what. This is what God's mercy can look like for a child."Written by Joy McElroy, Cherish All Children Executive Director

LETTER FROM YOUR PASTORS

Don't Ever Give Up!

50 years ago, one of the hottest bands in America was Three Dog Night. The band had 21 Billboard Top 40 hits between 1969 and 1975, with three hitting number one. The band formed in 1967,



was founded by vocalists Chuck Negron, Cory Wells, and Danny Hutton. This lineup was soon augmented by Jimmy Greenspoon, Joe Schermie, Michael Allsup, and Floyd Sneed. Today, the band is still touring, but the only remaining member is Danny Hutton. One of your pastors is excited about this band coming to *The Ledge* in Waite Park on Friday, July 19th (we will let you guess which one).

Three Dog Night has an interesting history. While the name Chuck Negron may not be immediately recognizable, for more than a decade he sang with the band. If you are old, or like "classic rock", you will probably remember a few familiar songs, "One Is the Loneliest Number," "Easy to Be Hard," and "An Old Fashioned Love Song."

For a while Chuck Negron had it all. He and his band had many top ten hits and sold 50 million records. He was rich. He was famous. He was on top of the world. He had everything - including an addiction to heroin that he just could not shake. It wasn't that he hadn't tried. During the course of his career, he made more than 100 attempts at rehabilitation - including 35 hospital stays - and yet Chuck failed repeatedly.

After pawning his gold records to buy cocaine, Chuck hit rock-bottom (no pun intended); he wound up living on the floor of an East L.A. crack house. He had lost everything. Everything, that is, except hope.

In spite of all his failed attempts, Chuck tried one more time. On September 17, 1991, he entered rehab for the 37th and final time. In a program called "Cri-Help" he finally, after 20 years of failure, won the battle. He remained clean for years, is still supportive of, and works with counseling and intervention programs for musicians. It took more than 100 tries, but he finally made it. Chuck is now 81.

You can read Chuck's story in his autobiography called *Three Dog Nightmare* published in 1999. A revised edition with several new chapters was released in 2008 and an updated version was released in 2018. If you read the book, you will be reminded of the times in your life when you have been tempted to give up too soon - deciding it was easier to live with losing than struggle for success.



If you are struggling for success, do not give up hope. Easter comes, but not without Good Friday. Remember the symbol of the Christian faith was once a symbol of failure and suffering. The cross was a sign of failure, torture, and death. The followers of Christ saw the cross and hid for shame fearing total failure.

You may be tempted to say, "It's just no use. I've failed at this too many times...Why should I keep trying? This is one habit I will never break, one sin I will never conquer, one failure I will never overcome."

Don't give up! You are not alone in your suffering! In fact, it is in suffering that we meet Christ! Easter does not come until after Good Friday. The cross is a reminder that Christ

walks with those who suffer and it gives us hope that sin will not have the last word. Are you willing to try again? Can you trust that you are not alone in your struggle?

For the message about the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the power of God. 1 Corinthians 1:18

The next time you see a cross, remember that it was once a sign of hopelessness and now is a symbol of hope. Then get back up. Even if you lose some battles along the way, Christ forgives. Christ walks with you, gives you strength and hope. When you no longer have the will, Christ will surround you with love and carry you. This is good news that is worth sharing, especially around Easter. Invite someone you know, especially someone who is struggling, to join you for worship at Atonement – here, they will see the embodiment of Christ's love!

A LITTLE LAUGHTER NEVER HURT

- On Easter Sunday our minister, trying to emphasize the celebration of Jesus' resurrection, asked the children if they had noticed any changes in the music from previous weeks. "For the last few Sundays, the music has been slow and somber," he reminded them, "but today it's upbeat and joyful. Do you know why?" No one ventured an answer until the organist's three-year-old daughter piped up, "Because Daddy's been practicing all week!"
- My wife's Aunt Aggie told me once that that there are four advantages to getting old and forgetful. "One, you meet new friends every day; two, every joke you hear is new; three, you can hide your own Easter eggs; and four . . . I forget the fourth thing."
- While driving to church on Easter Sunday two years ago, I told my children the Easter story. "This is the day we celebrate Jesus coming back to life," I explained. Right away, my 3-year-old son, Kevin, piped up from the back seat, "Will He be in church today?"
- A mother took her three-year-old daughter to church for the first time. The church lights were lowered, and then the choir came down the aisle, carrying lighted candles.
 All was quiet until the little one started to sing in a loud voice, "Happy birthday to you, Happy birthday to you..."
- A parent was having difficulty keeping his five-year-old son quiet during worship.
 Finally, when he saw that he wasn't succeeding, he picked up the little lad and hurried toward the door. As they neared the exit, the boy yelled loudly: Pray for me!

April Mission of the Month: Lincoln Center

The Lincoln Center is a project of Homeless Helping Homeless that is operated in conjunction with our volunteers, staff members, & supporters.

Individuals experiencing homelessness are some of the most oppressed individuals within our society.

The Lincoln Center was created to specifically act as a resource to all those experiencing homelessness. We are working to build a center that can act as a refuge for individuals during times when the weather is inclement or when otherwise needing respite from the stress of surviving without the basic necessities in life. Our center is a point of outreach & support for individuals experiencing homelessness or extreme poverty.

We are a 501(c)3 non-profit and will attempt to mediate any immediate need within our organization's means. Within our center we operate a 24/7 community snack bar available to our visitors and guests which features fresh water, hot coffee, an assortment of snacks, & meals each day to our guests and others in need. We also have resources available for guests to use to contact potential employers and housing opportunities, such as wi-fi, computers, and phones. We have televisions to help our visitors pass the time through entertainment, gaming, or otherwise.

At this time the Mission Donation Center will collect ramen meals, cereal and hygiene items only. The Lincoln Center is in need of night stands and book shelves for the private modules; if you have one to donate, please let the Mission Committee know. Anyone with time or donation to share can contact Kay or Kris and we will help make that happen. Up to 24 guests can stay in the new modules. People can come during the day. While we do not have a kitchen to make meals, we do have space to serve meals.

DONATION CENTER

The center, located across from the coat racks, has containers or a cart to accept the following:

- Collection of food for Salvation Army and McKinley Area Learning Center
- Place of Hope Laundry soap and personal hygiene items ONLY
- Homeless Helping Homeless Ramen meals, cereal, oatmeal packets, & hand soap (with a pump) ONLY
- Bus passes and gift cards for gas, groceries & leisure activities will be collected in a lockbox in the office and will be distributed to Anna Marie's Alliance, Terebinth Refuge, Sexual Assault Center & Pathways 4 Youth
- Used Cell Phones will be collected for Terebinth Refuge & Anna Marie's Alliance
