As we wrap up one year and open the next, my heart is full of gratitude for you. Your prayers, generosity, and faithful service are the quiet engine behind every life changed at Creekside. I see Jesus in the way you show up for God, for each other, and for our city. Thank you.

This year we are re-naming our gathering from the Annual Business Meeting to the Annual Business Celebration, because what follows is more than spreadsheets and minutes, it is praise reports. No confetti cannons yet, but if you see more smiles than motions tonight, you will know why.

Before we celebrate the metrics, I want to honor the people. Our amazing staff—Pastor Christina, Pastor Jesse, Monique, and Laurie—carry our mission with excellence and joy. A special word of appreciation to our "Perma-tern," Xander, who recently transitioned from our staff to pursue an opportunity for even greater growth. We celebrate your next step, we are proud of you, and we are grateful for your time at Creekside.

I am equally grateful for **Pastor Jacob Waldo** and **Pastor Ryan Imwalle.** Though not on paid staff, you serve and sacrifice as if you are. Pastor Jacob continues to love and lead our **CYC 180°** junior high students with consistency and care, pointing them to Jesus during a pivotal season of life. Pastor Ryan has been faithfully shepherding and growing **Celebrate Recovery** every Monday night, creating a safe place for healing, hope, and freedom. Your passion and pastoral hearts have strengthened our church community. Thank you.

To **Team Creekside**—from kids and youth leaders to greeters, tech, worship, facilities, and small-group guides—thank you.

You make church feel like family and Sundays feel like home. I am also deeply grateful for our **Creekside Council—Nat Springer**, **Kika Grupe**, **Greg King**, **and Michael Kirker**. Thank you for your prayerful leadership, steady wisdom, and dedication to Jesus and this assignment as you serve faithfully. Your integrity and teamwork strengthen Creekside in ways seen and unseen

It is evident God moved among us this year, clearly and powerfully. We witnessed 43 people go public with their faith in baptism and 48 say a fresh "yes" to Jesus. We welcomed many first-time guests, and our Covenant Membership rose to 197. Each week an average of 493 people engaged across adults, kids, youth, and online, and more than 165 participated in our Daring Faith all-church Small Group campaign. These are the fruits of Gathering, Growing, and Going, roots going deeper and the circle getting wider.

Numbers never tell the whole story, but they point to it: a student who found hope mid-week, a young family welcomed at the door who never looked back, a long-time attender who finally stepped into the waters of baptism, students launching Bible-based clubs on campus. Every number has a name, every name has a story, and every story matters to God.

We also set out to refine **Growth Track** to be more personal and focused, and the fruit has been real. People are moving from attending to belonging, discovering spiritual gifts, joining Creekside Small Groups, and stepping onto serving teams with confidence and joy.

Growth Track is our primary pathway of assimilation at Creekside because it gives every newcomer a clear next step, introduces our vision and values, and connects them to relationships and purpose. It benefits every believer by clarifying calling, strengthening foundations, and creating a steady rhythm of discipleship that makes faith practical. If you have completed Growth Track, thank you, keep living it out by serving, inviting, and bringing someone with you next round.

If you have not yet taken it, make this your next step. And to every Covenant Member, let's make Growth Track part of our regular vocabulary: "Have you done Growth Track yet?" Together we help people move from a class to a calling.

Across the campus, God has blessed us with tangible improvements that serve people well: new chairs that make our worship space more welcoming, repaired and fortified perimeter gates for safety, and upgraded cameras to better serve those who are not able to attend in person.

There are also projects still in process, not from lack of resources or resolve, but because we are committed to honoring God by stewarding your generous giving with integrity and intentionality. Even now, we are about to renovate our stage in preparation for LED screens, pursuing reliable vans for ministry, and actively exploring the feasibility of a preschool at Creekside. In all of this, our aim is simple: to be the kind of leaders Scripture describes, faithful with what has been entrusted to us. Just because we have not done something yet does not mean God is done.

Moving forward, we sense a holy nudge to remain creative and courageous. The world keeps changing, the Gospel does not. We will continue to adapt our methods while standing firm on Christ, and we will do it with purpose **FOR Martinez and the surrounding communities we love, WITH Excellence, LIKE Jesus.**

We are not content to be a church in the city; we will be the best church for our cities by seeking their good, serving the people, and opening doors to the Gospel through everyday acts of love. We will do ordinary things with extraordinary care for God's glory and our neighbor's good, because excellence is love in the details.

Through it all, our bullseye stays simple and bold: **helping people take their best next step in response to Jesus.** That is our part in the vision—to see those far from God become fully devoted followers of Jesus Christ. I truly believe the local church, alive in the Spirit, anchored in Scripture, engaged in its city, is the hope of the world, because Jesus works through His Church to heal, restore, and save.

So, Church, let us keep praying big, faith-filled prayers. We have seen God move, and we are asking for more: more transformed lives, more reconciled families, more students set on fire for Christ, more neighbors brought from searching to saved. As we Gather together unto Christ, Grow together in Christ, and Go together for Christ, I am inviting each of us to take three simple, powerful steps in the next 90 days: Join a Group. Join a Team. Invite Someone. Your step might seem small, but multiplied across this church, it becomes movement.

Thank you, Creekside, for being a people of faith, hope, and holy grit. The best is yet to come, and Kristen and I are honored to run this race with you.

Iln 2025 our Tiny Disciples Club, better known as Creekside Kidz, has made an impact in the Creekside classroom, with our families, and in our schools and community. We wrapped up another incredible season of Kidz Club and saw the occasional Wednesday kiddo become a faithful Sunday family. Our Kidz Club Team grew as we invited students (REACH Ambassadors) into a lane of service and discipleship. The impact we have on our Martinez Unified Schools grew exponentially as we were given the opportunity to host weekday Lunch Bunch on all four elementary campuses for the school year. We also discovered the power of togetherness as a team, seeing that the impact we have is a whole lot more effective when we each take part in carrying a piece of it to the finish line. This made way for team members to try new things, serve in new areas, and find ways to invite others to join the team.

Overall, the commitment to create Tiny Disciples was one that our team took seriously – from the Babiez to Olderz, our team knew the importance of their time spent with each friend, and used Sunday mornings, Wednesday nights, special events, and family ministry moments to plant seeds in the hearts and minds of our kids. Everything we do and every environment we create is focused on helping friends answer:

Preschool - 1st Grade: Who does God say I am?

2nd & 3rd Grade: Who do I say God is?

4th & 5th Grade: How am I going to tell my friends about it?

And we have seen our young people not just answer these questions for themselves, but start to ask these questions to their friends. Our friends know that they are created in His image, that He loves them, and that He sent Jesus to make our relationship with Him right again. They know they are good and don't always make the right choices, but Jesus doesn't hold that against them; in fact, He gives them the power to make a different choice next time. Most importantly, they are having conversations about Jesus with their friends – whether they are inviting them to a service or an event, telling them a piece of the story they learned, or sharing the cool thing Jesus helped them do.

Our Tiny Disciples are making other Tiny Disciples! And that tells me that God is at work in the lives of our youngest here at Creekside.

As the year goes on, there are ways that you can be a part of the Tiny Disciples Club as well. **You can:**

Pray - for our team members, kids, classrooms, schools, staff and faculties, and parents.

Partner - find a lane to serve in CKz. Whether Sunday morning, Wednesday night, or behind the scenes; it takes a crew to make CKz an environment where kids can meet Christ, and we would love to help you find your fit on the team.

Promote - maybe you don't have a kid and you don't serve on the team, but certainly there is someone in your life who can invite you to join in on the fun! With that, I do want to thank those who've made what we've done in CYC possible. Thanks to my wife, Brooke. Without her, I wouldn't be able to do any of this. Thanks to Pastor Jacob. His passion for Jesus and our students has strengthened our ministry and made me a better leader. Thanks to all our youth staff. You are the true ministers in our students' lives. Here are some wins we've been celebrating from this past year:

- We had a very successful return of the Dinner Auction in May. Many of our students served and were able to fund most of their camp cost by doing so.
- We were able to bring 83 students and 11 Youth Staff to our Summer Camp in July, where we praised God and learned to hear His voice more clearly.
- We had our first high school Summer Intern, and he was fantastic!
- Our Student Leaders completed one year of serving at CYC. Most are re-applying, and more are signing up to join the team!
- We now have 3 school Faith Clubs run by CYC students. The Light Club led by Brianna Crawford at Alhambra High School, College Park Revival led by Kayliegh Jewell at College Park, and Standing on Scripture led by Kathan King at Sequoia Middle School.
- We had our first Student-Lead Wednesday night, where students were in charge of
 everything for the whole service. They ran check-in and greeting, dinner serving, and
 games. We had students leading the worship team, preaching the sermon and
 leading small groups.
- Pastor Jacob started a program called REACH Ambassadors last year. As it has
 developed and grown, it has become a valid opportunity for our students to serve
 those younger than themselves!

• We're seeing our students stepping up to serve in areas all over our church including the worship team, tech team, and Kidz Ministry.

With all that we've seen God do, this is what we're looking forward to this next year:

- More Student-Lead Wednesdays so our students can serve, grow, and invite their friends into what they're doing. We see this as a great outreach opportunity.
- More partnership with other youth groups, especially with all of our students getting involved in Faith Clubs.
- We're looking for more training and discipleship opportunities as God continues to work in our students' lives.





New Council Candidates Process

When a council member's term ends (members can serve two consecutive 3-year terms, then must take at least one year off before being eligible again), we begin the process of selecting new candidates around August. Here's the procedure we follow:

Step 1: Initial Discussion & Prayer

- The council reflects on who is leaving, their contributions, and what skills or perspectives are needed moving forward.
- Before pastor input, council members suggest names, considering how potential candidates fit the established criteria. This process ensures equal input from the team and gives the pastor insight into who others see as leaders.

Step 2: Narrowing Candidates

- After the initial discussions, the council and pastor pray over the potential candidates and narrow the list to 2-4 names.
- · Criteria for further consideration include:
 - Membership: Bylaws require candidates to be a member.
 - **Investment**: A candidate's heart and commitment to the church.
 - Spiritual Growth: Evidence of consistent spiritual growth and fruit.
 - Gifts: The candidate's gift mix and how it complements the council.
 - Other Factors: The pastor may be aware of issues not discussed openly but that could affect nomination at this time.
 - Family Relations: We avoid placing relatives of staff or council members in leadership together.

Step 3: Final Decision

 At the next meeting, council members share their sense of the Lord's leading regarding the candidates, with the pastor sharing last. Typically, decisions are either unanimous or made by a strong majority.

Step 4: Contacting the Candidate

- The pastor contacts the selected candidate, explaining the council's unity in the decision and asking them to pray about the position.
- The candidate is given a week to consider potential concerns, such as work, family, or church commitments.

Council Candidate Approval Process

If the candidate accepts, the pastor conducts an interview focusing on their personal and spiritual growth, alignment with the church's vision, and relational integrity with staff, council, and congregation. They also discuss financial support for the church, as biblical tithing reflects investment in the church's mission. Afterward, the council meets with the candidate, and if satisfied, presents them to the congregation.

Congregation's Role

- The congregation is informed about the candidate and may submit written, signed concerns to the pastor and council. This step ensures integrity in the process.
- If no concerns arise, the candidate is presented for a vote at the Annual Business Celebration (ABC) or a special Sunday vote, depending on timing.

Questions from Congregation

- Why can't we nominate candidates?
 - To avoid turning the process into a political event, we focus on spiritual discernment. Public nominations could lead to unnecessary questioning or harm.
- Why only one candidate per seat?
 - Having only one candidate per seat helps preserve unity and trust within the church. Presenting multiple candidates could foster competition or division, whereas this approach emphasizes spiritual discernment and shared confidence in leadership rather than a popularity contest.

Candidate Commitment

- Commitment to Christ: Candidates should show continuous spiritual growth and dedication to following Jesus, evident beyond Sundays.
- Commitment to Creekside & Mission: Candidates should have a visible presence, align with the church's vision, and demonstrate leadership by serving in various ministries over time.

Council Candidate Qualifications

Character

Candidates should follow biblical guidelines from 1 Timothy 3 and Titus 1, focusing on their overall direction rather than perfection, avoiding glaring character issues.

- **Marriage:** If married, candidates should have a strong marriage, with their spouse's support for their leadership role.
- **Servant's Heart:** Candidates should be growth-oriented, responsible, dependable, and committed to biblical giving.
- **Team Spirit & Integrity:** They should be independent thinkers yet team players, demonstrating integrity in decisions (speak up, stand out, then support).
- Followership & Leadership: They should complement their leadership with strong followership, supporting leadership during tough times. Confidentiality is crucial.

Chemistry

Candidates should have good relational chemistry with the council and the broader church community.

- **Teamwork:** Candidates should work well with the team, avoid isolation or negativity, and show relational growth.
- Connection with Congregation: They should build relationships within the church and reach out to new people.
- Balanced Beliefs: They should hold to sound doctrine, avoiding fads or personal agendas.

Competency

Candidates should demonstrate basic skills and gifts for ministry, with a willingness to grow in the role.

- **Experience:** Candidates should not be new to Creekside; they should be known and trusted in the church.
- Leadership: They should initiate leadership areas and commit to personal growth.
- Balanced Representation: Candidates should not have an agenda tied to a specific ministry or staff member, but represent the whole church.
- **Financial Perspective**: Candidates should avoid extreme financial mindsets— whether expecting special treatment due to wealth or being unable to believe in faith for spiritual or financial growth.
