



How do we accomplish our mission?



In Dothan, Alabama

- Provide needs for the homeless and the needy in Dothan, Alabama Bible study, food, showers, laundry services, hygiene items, clothes.
- Free health care services every Thursday for the homeless, women from the House of Ruth and men and women from Houston County Community Corrections.
- Hotel Outreach every Wednesday where we provide prayer and a bagged meal for people living in low-end hotels.
- Outreaches such as on Thanksgiving Day, where we provide 300-plus meals to the homeless and needy.
- Human trafficking awareness campaign and outreaches. We bring awareness through sharing with local churches, youth groups, schools and civic clubs.

International ministry

- Hope Through Education providing scholarships and school supplies for impoverished children to attend school in the Philippines and Haiti. Building small schools in Philippines, Pakistan and Haiti for children who do not have a chance to receive an education. We believe education can help break the cycle of poverty.
- Provide food for the hungry/malnourished, with a strong focus on children.
- Support Grace Theological College in Yangon, Myanmar, to educate and train indigenous missionaries to reach Myanmar with the Gospel of Jesus Christ. More than 40 million people in Myanmar have never heard the Gospel.
- Provide clothing for the poor.
- Support indigenous pastors.
- Build churches in villages and towns.
- Provide Bibles and other discipleship materials such as Bible study guides.







Future goals

- Expand Human Trafficking Awareness & Rescue ministry in Dothan
- Build a warehouse to store supplies such as food and hygiene items, and to be able to accept furniture and appliances to help the homeless when they move into their own homes and help those in need in Dothan.
- Open a coffee house on our LIA campus to provide jobs, training and schooling for the homeless and needy in the inner city of Dothan. To provide them with the training, skills and hope of a better future by building a career in the hospitality industry. To provide a place for the public to connect with God, with others, and with LIA.
- Build small houses on our LIA campus to provide homes for the homeless. They will go through a 1-2 year program to learn the life and job skills needed to live a normal, productive life on their own.
- Expand efforts internationally, including in China
- Drill fresh water wells in Third World and Developing nations.
- Build orphanages
