My sister died way too young. Five years after the first round of cancer we received the news that the cancer had returned. Fear immediately set in and all I could do is focus on it, the future was incredibly scary. How can this be; she's so young, she has a husband and babies that need their mommy. It's not fair. I began to beg God, I doubted God's word, these were all real feelings... they hurt and it was hard!

When fear and darkness comes knocking on your door, turn to God, tell him you're scared, tell him you doubt Him. Let Him comfort you, and do your best to keep your focus on Him. Don't allow fear to have access in your life, surround yourself with positive reinforcement like praise and worship music, podcasts that will encourage you, get your people around you, you know the ones who will support you and not judge you during your time of discouragement. Turn to the Bible and let God's word cradle you. He completely understands, keep your focus on Him not the darkness that has been placed on your life, and accept that sometimes we will have to walk through the darkness, and remember that in His timing He WILL turn our pain to peace.

John 4:10-14 (NIV)

10 Jesus answered her, "If you knew the gift of God and who it is that asks you for a drink, you would have asked him and he would have given you living water."

11 "Sir," the woman said, "you have nothing to draw with and the well is deep. Where can you get this living water? 12 Are you greater than our father Jacob, who gave us the well and drank from it himself, as did also his sons and his livestock?"

13 Jesus answered, "Everyone who drinks this water will be thirsty again, 14 but whoever drinks the water I give them will never thirst. Indeed, the water I give them will become in them a spring of water welling up to eternal life."

This devotional isn't long enough to go into the details of this full story in depth. I would encourage you to dive in deeper to see more of what God is saying. There are a wealth of books and resources on the story of the woman at the well that answer questions like, Why was Jesus going to Samaria? Why did He stay behind? Why was it odd for Jesus to communicate with this woman? Etc.

Today I want to talk about thirst. It's interesting that the conversation starts out talking about water but very quickly turns to thirst. When reading this text, the definition of thirst, "a strong desire for something" is what I feel like Jesus is conveying to her. This is why he tells her to go and bring her husband in the next verse. It's not because He wants to give a man a drink of water, it's because He wants to begin to breakdown for her that she has a "strong desire for something" and she has been quenching this thirst with the wrong thing.

How many times have we jumped from situation to situation; relationship to relationship; job to job because of a restlessness in our souls. We know that there must be more to this life but we just can't seem to find that satisfying place. That desire for true fulfillment is a thirst that only God can fill. It's not that you need a new relationship, you may just be thirsty and need to intensify your relationship with God. You may not need a new job. You may just be thirsty and need God to rain down His purposes into your soul. You may not need a new group of friends, maybe God is calling you to lead your current group on a spiritual journey to deeper connections with Him.

God is the ultimate thirst quencher! He will place desires in your heart that will only be fulfilled as you live your life achieving His purposes. How do you get to these deeper levels? By doing the things that are often mentioned in church. Spend daily time reading the Bible. Prayer. Praise and worship. Fasting. And lastly, time. Don't forget these things take time.

PRAYER: Lord, I completely open my soul and spirit to you right now and declare that I want more of You in my life. Help me to surrender my will so that your presence permeates every aspect of my life. Fill me up Lord like never before. In Jesus' name.

We all have addictions

At some point in our lives we will all find ourselves living in denial of some addiction. At that point we will have to ask ourselves if we really want things to change. The addiction may be food, illegal drugs, alcohol, sexual, prescription drugs, work, controlling others, serving others and not being there for our own family, fishing, sports, dance, tv, or just over medicating ourselves with social media, it can all be controlling. We all have an addiction story; yours may be just titled a little differently.

We need the grace of God to break the addictions; we need to allow God to heal us. We must identify the addiction, admit that it is an addiction and that it is controlling us, and that we need freed from it. We need God's unfailing love. When you truly surrender, God steps in, when you allow him to be in charge of your life, His power takes over to change you. Stop pushing God out of your life!

In John 5:6 Jesus asked the man, "Do you want to get well?" This is on you, you have to decide, your people can't help you until you make the decision that you want to get well, and find freedom from whatever is holding you hostage. If you will humbly embrace this and allow God to work on you, and you are honest with yourself, you will begin to get a handle on the addiction and overcome it. You will walk free!

It is not good for you to be alone.

At Family Christian Center, in addition to our Sunday services, we have several small groups that meet throughout the week to give you the opportunity to connect with people around a common interest, a book, or the Bible. Take advantage of the opportunities to connect. These are relationships that God has designed to help you grow as a believer. They will prove invaluable to you over time.

Help me to see where I may have been closed off to relationships so that I can lower my walls and let people in. I know that I can trust You to lead me to people who will help me grow in my faith. Romans 13:1-7 Let every soul be subject to the governing authorities. For there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God. So maybe if that is not the route we are going to take, we should shut our mouths and prayerfully support our employers and fellow employees. As Christians, let's set the standard as we respect our leadership.
