I am pleased to have been called to be your priest until a more permanent arrangement is made. I am also very excited about the time we will spend together. I am already at work for a very special Advent, working with John Novack in that planning. My door is always open to you and I mean always! If you happen to be in the church and want to poke your head in just to say hello, do it. My personal cell line is also available - (859) 285-9361. Please don't hesitate to give me a call should you need anything, or just want to chat. The schedule for services will remain the same. I will be leading worship three Sundays a month (typically the first three) and the Zoom Gatherings at 9AM Sunday on those days. The Zoom Gatherings will also happen on the Sundays when Morning Prayer is taking place in the nave. The group as a wonderful bunch of lay leaders who are happy to meet, pray, and discuss scripture without me present. Liturgy of the Word at St. James will continue to be our practice on the fourth Sunday of each month. Most importantly, St James remains an important member of the GRI and our attendance at the Jubilee services remain a top priority of mine and the Church Leadership. I want to encourage you to participate in both and that I plan to be present when my schedule allows. During those times when I am present, I would like to be among you as one who worships from the pew, not to evaluate the service, nor do I expect to offer any leadership unless specifically invited to do so by the presider. I would further suggest that on those occasions my leadership be limited to the absolution and blessing - barring some last minute emergency. When present on the Fourth Sunday, I am content to participate from the pew, lending my voice to that of the congregation. Whichever you choose your communication will be treated as confidential within the understanding of what that means for a priest, I will hold that confidence. Bobbi Jo has graciously agreed to be the keeper of the appointment calendar, making appointments for my scheduled office days of Wednesdays and Thursdays. This does not mean that these will be the only days and times I will be available for appointments. If you cannot make, or simply prefer another day or times outside those scheduled, let her know that and we will make the necessary adjustments to make the appointment work for you. Finally, we expect discussions around the Search Process will begin this Fall and I bid your prayers for that process.
