





At the Special Called Business Meeting January 17 during Morning Worship the church approved the following motion with 358 yes & 40 no votes:

The Phase 2 Committee recommends that authority be granted to the Phase 2 Committee to proceed with the construction and renovation of the former Goff-McNair properties with a connecting foyer at an estimated budgeted cost of \$3,650,000. This authority will include initiating bids, granting bids, and overseeing construction. All costs, including but not limited to, construction costs, architectural fees, city permits, surveys, and furnishings, are included. A variance over 5% will require additional church approval.

Thus says the LORD, your Redeemer, who formed you from the womb: "I am the LORD, who made all things, who alone stretched out the heavens, who spread out the earth by myself."

Every generation faces the task of standing for truth and justice while opposing evil. In the 1800's our forefathers paid a terrible price to end slavery in our nation. In the 20th century our grandparents and parents (and some of you!) fought and won two world wars to halt the spread of tyranny. The costs to individuals, families, and our nation was much higher than we can comprehend. Then came the need to fight the cold war, sometimes on the battlegrounds of other countries;

always with a vigilance for freedom.

The current generation faces an evil which cloaks itself as a stand for rights and compassion, but in practice uses deadly force for profit: the abortion industry. Before this year ends, over 50 million abortions will have taken place in America since the Supreme Court issued its Roe v. Wade ruling on January 22, 1973. In the light of this shameful reality, God's people must not be silent.

How do we stand against this great evil while at the same time demonstrating the love of Christ? Jesus Himself provided the perfect example of this, being declared in John's gospel as being "full of grace and truth" (John 1:14). His example always demonstrated compassion and grace while clearly proclaiming the will of God.

Pray. Know that our heavenly Father cares for the hopeless and helpless. Pray for hearts to change, for overwhelmed expectant mothers to find support, for broken families to find healing. Pray for compassion, forgiveness, and restoration.

Give. Through the Cooperative Program, our church supports several children's homes (www.abchomes.org), including a home for unwed and pregnant teenage girls. We also support a local crisis pregnancy center which offers free counseling, pregnancy tests, ultrasounds, and support (www.lovingchoices.org).

Get involved. Volunteer at a crisis pregnancy center. Support adoption. Show compassion instead of condemnation. Refuse to vote for pro-abortion politicians. Participate in local, positive stands for life. Get informed using trustworthy sites (www.nambforlife.org) to find articles, statistics, and videos.

May our children and grandchildren look back to our generation and know that as followers of Christ we lived out grace and truth as we defended life for those who are most vulnerable.


