

We live in a wonderful marketplace of ideas, but the most cherished idea of our society too often seems profit. The freedom to make money by any legal means overrides . cherished idea of our society too often seems to be the hope of concepts of right and wrong. No place is this more evident than

in the entertainment media. Under the guise of "freedom of expression" or "freedom of speech," any programming they choose to offer is supposed to be accepted – even welcomed – as if no one else has a voice in the matter.

When other voices raise complaints about the appropriateness of the content being offered, the producers of the content cry, "Foul." "We have the right to our creative content." And other people have the right to speak against what has been created, especially when it is foisted upon public airwaves for general, public usage.

It is appropriate for dissenting voices to be heard. Raising our voices in opposition to disgraceful content or conduct communicates a message that some productions are not acceptable to significant segments of society.

In truth, decisions to remove objectionable media content, like the recent canceling of "The Book of Daniel" by KNWA, come from hearing broad-based objection and seeing it matched by real-life rejection. That is, do not support it. Nationally, "The Book of Daniel" lost two million viewers (29%) from the premier week. People saw the poor content and turned it off. We make a difference when our walk matches our talk.

Paul and Silas learned that interfering with the profits of people creates trouble! It led to their arrest, to ridicule of their beliefs, and to a beating followed by imprisonment. While the consequences may be different in our marketplace, people still react negatively when their profits are squeezed (or speech/expression/idea is rejected). Yet, it is important that our voices be heard.
