It is refreshing to see how God works in all circumstances for His glory. Sometimes everything seems to go as you hope; other times you face difficulty and struggle. Yet, we know God is at work at all times and we can trust His faithfulness.

Here are three important happenings in the life of our church family.

1. A special, called business meeting is being announced for Sunday, March 13 following Engage Worship for the purpose of calling a new church administrator. The Personnel Committee has prayerfully worked since January and is ready to make a recommendation to the church. Because this individual works in our region in the private sector, we will not be able to release his name until the morning of March 13. He will share his testimony in both morning worship services and we will have an opportunity to vote by ballot on the recommendation that

evening. Pending church approval, it is anticipated that he will officially join our church staff on April 4. I thank God for the work of our Personnel Committee.

- 2. As an important part of our Phase 2 construction project, the electric power service will be moved and upgraded during Spring Break, March 21-26. The church's electric service will be disconnected during this transition. While the church offices will be closed and no activities will be scheduled on the church property that week, the church staff will be active. We are already planning the printing of newsletter and bulletin, cleaning of the property, and ministry opportunities. While there will be challenges, I expect this to be an exhilarating time of ministry as we unleash from the buildings and enjoy other aspects of connecting with people.
- 3. You may have heard about the serious flood covering the entire lower auditorium as a result of the recent storms. The church staff arrived at the office Monday morning to discover extremely wet carpet. The source of the water became apparent, although the amount of water was unbelievable. As I write this article on Monday, we are still working with water restoration crews and preparing for discussions with insurance companies. We are blessed that almost all of the walls are concrete block with very little drywall. It does not appear that any equipment has been damaged, although several bookshelves in the library will need to be replaced. It also appears that all of the carpet will need to be removed and replaced.

This cleanup will not happen overnight, but it has begun and will be an important focus over the next several weeks. I appreciate our custodial crew working quickly to move all of our furnishings to other locations, allowing the water removal teams to work without hindrance. As we learn more about all of this, we will pass the word forward.

In all of this - the Good, the Bad (really, just an inconvenience) and the Ugly - God is sovereign. How we respond to the different circumstances in life helps us see where we need to grow, where we need to trust God, and where we can celebrate. Thank you, Father, as you work for our good and Your glory.


# Women's Thursday Bible Study begins March 10 at 9:30 am




