One of the things I love about spring is the noticeable increase of activities for missions and other ministries. All of the anticipation and planning for spring mission trips is on the cusp of fulfillment. Easter preparations are in full swing as we get ready to welcome 1000+ people to celebrate together the resurrection of Jesus. Summer mission trip dates are being adjusted with the schedules of missionaries at home and abroad to maximize our impact for Christ.

There are many ministries and mission trips for which you can pray and support. During Spring Break, one university team will be conducting a Kids'

Bible Club in the courtyard and playground of an apartment complex in south Fayetteville. As they complete each day's work at the apartments, they will distribute door packets to 500 families in that area to invite them to Easter worship with us.

Another university team will be traveling during Spring Break to Nashville to reach Indian Hindus with the gospel. They will partner with a local church there to provide a Kids' Bible Club at an apartment complex and to invite ethnic businesses to a South Asian festival.

Our youth and families will minister through Mission Arlington to children and families all across that region in Texas with Kids' Bible Clubs and other helping ministries. Many of these students have participated in this mission trip for several years and do an excellent job of sharing the gospel of Jesus with those in need.

Lisa and I will be traveling to New York City in late March to work with Foreign Service Fellowship as a table host and hostess during the annual "Cross-cultural Easter Celebration Dinner and Concert." 200-250 distinguished U.N. ambassadors, diplomats and their spouses are expected to attend. These leaders from all around the world, attending out of personal friendship and respect, will hear the gospel presented as they learn why Christians celebrate Easter.

Lance Brewer is inviting dozens of people to be parking lot attendants and greeters for Easter morning. We want our guests to be know they are welcomed as they find their way around the church campus. Easter morning will be a great day of worship!

Several mission trips are being planned for the summer, too! Work with our partner trip in Spearfish, SD, will take a team to Belle Fourche to work with a new church with block parties and neighborhood canvassing. Our partners in Ekaterinburg, Russia, have invited us to help them with a camp in nearby Krausnofimsk. Others are preparing for a youth choir trip to Texas, Vacation Bible School work in Indonesia, medical missions in Ecuador. Other mission trips and ministries are planned. Even better, God is at work in places and people not yet on our radar.

Let us shake off winter hibernations and enthusiastically reach our community, nation, and world with the good news of Jesus!


