

Dr. Hemphill has served as guest professor and lecturer in seminaries and colleges throughout the United States and in Scotland, including the School of Evangelism in Scotland; Southern Baptist Theological Seminary, Louisville, Kentucky; Beeson Divinity School of Samford University, Birmingham, Alabama; Oklahoma Baptist University, Shawnee, and New Orleans Baptist Theological Seminary.

Dr. Hemphill is also a prolific writer. Among his seven published books are *The Antioch Effect, The Bonsai Theory of Church Growth and Mirror, Mirror on the Wall: Discovering Your True Self Through Spiritual Gifts.*

ORGAN UPDATE

Dan Garland, organ builder from Ft. Worth, has completed the digitization on our organ console. He is waiting for Jim Dyson, craftsman from Monticello, to complete the refinishing of the console's exterior and its delivery to Fayetteville. At that point, Mr. Garland will arrive on site with the "works" of the console and our new pipes. He estimates that his work in cleaning the pipes and their chambers, installing the new pipe work, reassembling the console itself and reconnecting will take about two weeks. We hope to have the organ back in service in late March or early April.

- 1. **Arkansas:** Lynn Loyd the director of the Baptist Collegiate Ministry will take a team to Helena, Arkansas. They have 9 students and will join with other BCM's in our state to provide for backyard Bible clubs and evangelism efforts in the poorest areas of this community and will lead some services in churches there.
- 2. Brazil: Steve Moore, Minister of College & Career, will lead a team of six students to two churches in Brazil. The students are: Mariann Bulger, Laura Lacy, Jesse Loyd, JD Weathers and Brian Brixey. This team will do the first Leadership Conference of Next Level Leadership with the North American Mission Board in Portuguese at Memorial Baptist Church in Sao Paulo. This was Steve & Laura's church there. Also they will do this conference in Sao Jose dos Campos with the First Baptist Church there in the same state. They will also visit on several major university campuses including the USP which has 64,000 students. This group will leave March 17 and return March 27.
- 3. **Mexico:** Travis Wollenberg, Minister of Adults, will lead a team to Celaya, in Guanajuato, Mexico. Going with Travis will be Janell Bailey, Carol Butter, Margaret Little, David and Barbara Moore, Virginia Rose, Lisa Wheat and Janet Wilder. There they will set up an eye clinic, a medical clinic and share the gospel. This group will leave March 18 and return March 25.
- 4. **Mississippi:** Brian Key, assistant to Lynn Loyd and associate to the collegiate minister of UBC, will take a group of university students to their base in Pascagoula, Mississippi to assist with clean-up, evangelism, and service projects for Katrina-damaged areas.
- 5. **Texas:** Steve Alberts, Minister of Students, will lead a group of our youth on the Mission Arlington Missions Trip, March 19th-24th! They will be in the inner city apartment complexes running two "Back Yard Bible Studies" per day. The students will lead children of varying ages in Bible studies and testimony sharing.
