





## Mt. Hope East Asia Trips


October 15-25 &

In late April I attended a Central and Eastern Europe (CEE) missions summit sponsored by the International Mission Board held in Sherwood, AR. Also attending were my wife and Margaret Little. Missionaries from all over the CEE region (including Rusty Hart from Ekaterinburg, Russia) led in conferences and break-out sessions, sharing about God's work in their area and inviting others to come and join them in the labor. It was a great summit!

During one of the break-out sessions, God began to clarify in my heart how He sent His people to be His witnesses as recorded in the Book of Acts. The Bible shows us in Acts how first the apostles and then Paul boldly preached the gospel so that lost men and women could respond in faith to the grace of Jesus. But these witnesses did not merely make converts. No, they made disciples. Wherever they went and preached, as people trusted in Jesus a new church developed to equip, to encourage, and to evangelize. They invested their lives in a people and a place. (There are too many to list them all. See Acts 11:25-26; 18:8-11; 20:1-3, 31; 28:23, 30-31).

As God worked in my heart, I reviewed how First Baptist Church lives out God's command to be His witnesses, to make disciples. We have a strong practice of evangelism and missions, taking seriously our responsibility to tell others everywhere that Jesus is mighty to save. I am convinced that we are most effective when we, like the early believers, intentionally invest ourselves in a specific place and people.

It excited me to remember where we have focused our attention as a church. Our partnering with The New Community Church in Rogers will help us make a difference through that local church in that region. Our adoption of "Mt. Hope" in East Asia is already bearing fruit as we make a difference through believers in that region. There are at least three or four other areas where we have continuing partnerships to assist believers to make a difference in their regions: Boston, MA; San Diego, CA; Gulfport, MS.

There will be other people and places where we will invest ourselves. Maybe we will partner with a church in Russia. Or Bosnia. Maybe Mexico. Or Ecuador. Perhaps it will not be an "either/or" proposition but "both/and" as God leads us into more areas than we can imagine today.

What I know for certain is that God continues to call us to Fayetteville, NW Arkansas and the rest of the United States, and even to the ends of the earth. We are His witnesses!






