their potential because we have not sought the Father's will or been empowered by the Holy Spirit.

We try to be helpful as we inform them of the variety of giving opportunities that are available. Yet, for a person who is not a member of First Baptist Church or wanting something more general, the number of specific options is not helpful.

When the Arkansas Baptist Foundation (ABF) recently began informing churches that the ABF can help churches establish a church endowment, our Stewardship Committee began exploring this opportunity. As a result, they voted to establish an endowment fund for First Baptist Church, creating a giving vehicle for individuals to make gifts with the potential to generate income for increased ministry.

Whether giving through the FBC endowment as a memorial or including it in a will or trust, this opportunity for giving will provide another option to support the ministry of First Baptist Church for the building of God's kingdom. A bulletin insert this Sunday will give you additional information and we plan to have a guest from the ABF to come and share with us how the endowment can be beneficial.

We long to use every resource from the hand of God to be used to proclaim the gospel for the glory of God.




