SOUTHERN BAPTIST CONVENTION

The annual meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention will be in San Antonio, TX, June 12-13, preceded by the excellent Pastors' Conference June 10-11. Pray for the messengers that you have elected: my family, Bill and Carol Brunner, and Gerald and Anne Jones. The meeting is a large business meeting encompassed by great music, preaching, and fellowship. I have attended several SBC annual meetings and always find them to be encouraging, inspiring, and informative.

One note: do not believe everything you read or hear about the convention from the national media. They often misunderstand what Baptists are accomplishing or report the events in a manner which is much more sensational than what occurs at the meetings. I will try to report on the highlights of the SBC from my perspective. If you have questions, ask me or any of our messengers and we will help you know what happened.

INVITATION TIME

The time of response following the sermon, commonly called the invitation, is an essential part of our worship services. As the Holy Spirit has been convicting, encouraging, and correcting individuals, the invitation is the time in the worship service specifically designed for us to make public and private decisions. All of our time of worship calls for our response, but the invitation is a unique aspect of the service.

Because of the importance of the invitation, I need your help. Many people, especially those sitting under the balcony and many sitting in the balcony, have made it a pattern to leave during the invitation. Some weeks it looks like a stampede for the early exit. Please reconsider leaving during the invitation! If I were to cancel the invitation, there would rightfully be an outcry. When someone leaves during the invitation, they are denying themselves the opportunity to respond to God's work. Even worse, they distract and discourage others from responding. The message sent is that the invitation is not important.

I am aware that some people need to slip out before the rush of the crowd begins. We will continue to make announcements and to present those who make decisions after the invitation, leaving ample time for those individuals to leave easily and safely.

For everyone else, we consistently dismiss the morning worship close to noon. Please take full advantage of the entire worship service and be prepared to respond to the moving of God in your heart. During the invitation, pray for God to work in you and in the lives of many people. As we yield our heart to the Lord, may revival begin in us.

URGENT NEEDS FOR RUSSIA TRIP
