Thank you for encouraging me to attend the annual meeting of the Southern Baptist Convention in Orlando. The convention and the Pastors' Conference which precedes it are great events which inspire, motivate and challenge me each time I attend. The 2-day conference is a lot of preaching (10-12 sermons) from some great pastors of our convention who faithfully proclaim God's Word. The 2-day convention is a time for all of the entities of the SBC to report on the past and cast vision for the future. The messengers (representatives from Southern Baptist churches all over the nation) make their voices heard on motions and resolutions which state our beliefs,

challenge our churches, and set direction for our entities.

This year, in addition to all of the other reports, a special team called the Great Commission Resurgence (GCR) Task Force presented their report and recommendations. This team had been appointed the previous year by the SBC president with the responsibility to evaluate the overall efficiency and effectiveness of the SBC entities in supporting the churches in accomplishing the Great Commission and to make recommendations on how we can improve. Their report and recommendations were met with much discussion and differences of opinion.

There is not enough space in this entire newsletter for me to give an adequate portrayal of all the discussion, amendments, and ramifications of the GCR report and recommendations. This Sunday evening during Engage Worship I intend to share as much as I reasonably can about the convention and the GCR discussions.

I went to the convention expecting that, after the report and discussions, I would vote against the recommendations of the GCR Task Force. An important change was made from the floor of the convention which, in my opinion, strengthened the overall recommendation. While I still have some reservations about parts of it, I voted with the majority to approve the GCR recommendations.

If you had attended the convention, I believe you would have been encouraged by the passionate discussions which evidenced a deep love for our Lord and a strong commitment to work together to reach this nation and the nations with the gospel of Jesus Christ. The primary focus this year - and every year I have attended the convention - is to lift up the cross of Christ that all peoples may be saved.

I am glad to be a Southern Baptist.
