For wicked men are found among My people, they watch like fowlers lying in wait; they set a trap, they catch men. Like a cage full of birds, so their houses are full of deceit; therefore they have become great and rich. They are fat, they are sleek, they also excel in deeds of wickedness; they do not plead the cause, the cause of the orphan, that they may prosper; and they do not defend the rights of the poor.

Jeremiah 5:26-28

Here it comes again. It seems like every year or so some of our elected state officials begin to promote a bill to legalize gambling of one sort or the other. This year there is a massive effort by Lieutenant Governor Bill Halter to urge the voters of Arkansas to approve a constitutional amendment creating a state-run lottery. Let's defeat it again.

While gambling is always promoted as a financial boon for the state, the numbers do not add up. Do the states which already have the lottery have an excess of money? But even if they did, it is immoral for our state to promote gambling which preys on the poor and disadvantaged to the benefit of the state government. The end does not justify the means. It is the responsibility of the state to defend the poor, not take their resources for the wealthy.

An excellent website for you to visit is <u>www.nolotteryarkansas.com</u>. The site is affiliated with Arkansas Faith and Ethics Council. Here is some of the information listed there:

The Atlanta Journal-Constitution discovered that Georgia Lottery ticket sales averaged \$249 per resident in zip codes where the average annual income is less than \$20,000 and only \$97 per resident in zip codes with average incomes above \$40,000.

- Since 1990, per capita taxes in lottery states have risen more than three times as fast as in non-lottery states.
- No state lottery works unless it is marketed to the poor. In fact, many lottery marketing programs revolve around the time of welfare and social security check distributions.
- A study by the Delaware Council of Gambling Problems discovered that lottery machines are strategically placed in poor neighborhoods. There were no machines in the highest-income areas of the state, one for every 17,000 in upper-income areas, one for every 5,000 in lower-middle to middle income areas, and one for every 2,000 in the lowest-income areas.

In no way is God glorified by any of the promotions or workings of the lottery or other forms of gambling. The promises of financial benefit are fool's gold. The state becomes a predator on the poor. The lottery is a losing bet. Let's work to tell the truth about gambling and vote in November to defeat this amendment.
