### Early Christian Material Culture-taught by Natalie Hall

This six-week course is a *visual* tour of Early Christianity (ca. AD 30-600) in which we will scrutinize surviving texts, art, and architecture to reveal the daily lives of our Christian forefathers, the many issues of faith and orthodoxy they were forced to defend, and the growth of the Christian religion. What did their churches look like? What role did baptism play in the early Church? Of what did a typical worship service consist? What stories from the Bible were most popular? What was a typical church calendar and what



holidays did the early Christians celebrate? Why are the catacombs of Rome an important part of our Christian heritage? What problems emerged as Christians grew in number in the Roman Empire and how were they resolved? These and other issues will be discussed in this survey of Early Christianity to make evident our Christian heritage and to reveal God at work throughout history. *Begins Sunday, September 11 at 5pm. ### Me, Myself and Lies-by Jennifer Rothschild. Led by Kerry Cochran

In this eight-week study Jennifer shares practically and helpfully from her own life and from Scripture to show how every woman can turn her words—and her life—around for good. This six-week Bible study for women encourages them to clean out the junk in their thoughts and replace these hidden negative thoughts and failures with positive truths from God's word. Rather than struggling with self-esteem, body image, stress and other unhealthy thoughts and emotions learn to replace the lies you may have been telling yourself with the truth from God's word. *This women's study begins Wednesday, August 31 at 6pm. ### He Speaks to Me-by Priscilla Shirer. Led by Kathe Dees

Priscilla draws life lessons from the account of God speaking to the boy Samuel. In this beloved Bible story found in 1 Samuel 3, Priscilla relates six characteristics found in Samuel that are applicable to women today as they tune their hearts to hear God's voice. These characteristics are: A Simple Relationship, A Set Apart Holiness, A Still Attentiveness, A Single-Minded Worship, A Sold Out Hunger, and A Servant's Spirit. By listening to God's voice and obeying Him, women will be drawn into a closer relationship to God that brings a deeper desire to serve Him faithfully. *This women's study begins Thursday, September 8 at 9:30am. ### Philippians-How to Have Joy-by Kay Arthur. Led by Cay Thorn


