Strong and weak Christians, old-timers and new-comers, lost men and women, occasional attenders and "never miss a meeting" folks – the whole gamut attends! This is a time we invite people to come **Encounter** our risen Savior and invite Him to be Lord.

On September 28, an important change is coming for Sunday evenings. During this time we will challenge Christians to **Engage** the Scriptures in preparation for engaging the culture. Our style will become much more contemporary in our communication styles, both in the preaching and in the music. By not replicating Sunday mornings, we will strive to reach people we do not currently reach, but the larger goal is to strengthen believers to make a difference in our community.

On Wednesday evenings, we have a remarkable number of families who are **Enrich**ed by the fellowship and unity that come through the shared meal, music, and missions, as well as the prayer time and Bible study, teachers' meetings, and other studies. We invite Christians to broaden their relationship with Christ as they experience a more intimate relationship with one another.

**Encounter** – reaching the heights, **Engage** – exploring the depths, **Enrich** – expanding our breadth.

Join me in praying that we would be effective in fulfilling our call.
