

Therefore encourage one another and build up one another, just as you also are doing. 1 Thessalonians 5:11

Everyone needs encouragement and it can compel us to accomplish more than we believe we can do.

Like many of you, I have a child playing sports. This week, as I watched my son's soccer team in action, one boy on his team was driving down the field with the ball. Right in front of where I was sitting, a boy from the opposing team came and stole the ball. As I watched the boy, for a moment he slowed to a trot and hung

us head. He felt beaten and appeared discouraged. With a call of his name, I encouraged him to go after the ball. "You can take him!" I cheered.

Tony glanced up to see who was yelling at him then, remarkably, turned on his speed. He caught up to the other boy and took the ball. Before the end of the game, he scored twice. Now, Tony didn't score because I cheered for him, but with honest encouragement he did re-take the ball that had been taken from him. And perhaps because of that small victory, he grew in confidence which led to greater victory.

In truth, all of us need encouragement. There are times during which we each struggle, trip, and fail. But failure does not need to be reinforced but overcome.

One of God's instructions to us is to encourage one another and to build up one another. When the people of God obey this command, we stand in contrast to a prevailing attitude of our society. It has become a sport to tear down one another. Some watch for a politician or football coach to stumble so they can kick them. They look for bosses or administrators to slip so they can call for them to be fired. They prey on the wounded and weak, expecting they can be devoured. They gossip and badmouth and deride.

In the community of faith – the family of God, the bride of Christ – we see the struggles of one another and join them there. We remind them that they are not alone and that we expect great things from them. We tell them how we see God at work in their lives and urge them to live for God. We affirm and pray for and support.

This week, look around and see if anyone around you is discouraged. Commit to encouraging that one and watch as God uses you to build up one another. In your obedience to God, you will join Him in accomplishing His work in the life of another and bring God glory and honor.


