Activities throughout the current six-week timeframe (beginning September 23) remind of the importance of denominational partnerships to our ministries at First Baptist Church. Churches of all sizes can be lulled into thinking that they can accomplish more on their own while pointing fingers at waste – real and imagined – within denominational structures.

I have discovered throughout my 23 years of ministry that our partnerships with other churches through local Baptist associations, state conventions and the Southern Baptist Convention (SBC) enrich the local church ministry while also allowing us to accomplish more with partners than we could ever do alone. Here are a few recent examples:

Bikes, Blues, and BBQ – The 4-day event is loud and disruptive. It makes driving around town a hassle, especially if you work at the corner of College and Dickson! But our partnership with the Arkansas Baptist Bikers Association (ABBA) allowed our teams, organized by Rick McCoy, to minister effectively to hundreds of bikers. I was impressed with the numbers attending our free Saturday breakfast and grateful to hear a gospel witness shared with both the whole group and individuals.

Partnership with Streams of Life Church in Ekaterinburg – A team led by Mike Paslay ministered side -by-side with these brothers and sisters in Christ, encouraging one another, worshipping together, and reaching that city with the gospel. Our connection came through our international missionaries sent by local churches and appointed by the International Mission Board (IMB) of the SBC.

Annual meeting of the Washington Madison Baptist Association (WMBA) – This meeting was hosted by Elmdale Baptist Church in Springdale. We had 10 official messengers, but 15 or so members of FBC attended. Reports and sermons challenged us to reach the world with the gospel.

Baptist Collegiate Ministry (BCM) – The University of Arkansas is a tremendous mission field. Our work with Lynn Loyd of the Arkansas Baptist State Convention (ABSC) provides a great launching pad for ministry to the campus. We have ministered through the BCM at Salt and Impact meetings in October, reaching students and their friends.

ABSC meeting – A busy three days of sermons, ministry reports, and worship awaits us next week at FBC in Benton. We will hear updates on our ministries taking place all across the state and instruct our state agencies for the work in the coming year. I am honored to represent you as I preach the convention sermon to conclude the meeting.

Partnership with "Judah" – A team led by Lisa Wheat will be leaving in early November to work with partners living in a country closed to missionaries and the freedom to share the gospel. With this partnership, our work is better planned and will have consistent follow-up when we leave.

Thank you for working together to build the Kingdom of God!

I am thankful to be a part of a church that is Kingdom-minded and willing to do whatever it takes to share the love of Christ with people outside of their comfort zone. It is so exciting to see what God can do when we allow ourselves to be used by Him for His honor and glory.


