
Tickets are available at the kitchen on Wednesday evenings and in the office during regular office hours through

OPERATION CHRISTMAS CHILD NEEDS YOU!

- Use an empty shoe box (standard size, please) or a small plastic container. You can wrap the box (lid separately), but wrapping is not required. Most importantly, pray for the child who will receive your gift.
- Determine whether your gift will be for a boy or a girl, and the child's age category: 2-4, 5-9, or 10-14. Pick up a label at the Information Center, mark the correct age category on the label, and tape the label to the top of your box.
- Fill the box with a variety of gifts that will bring delight to a child. Use the gift ideas provided below.
- Please donate \$7 or more for each shoe box you prepare to help cover shipping and other project costs.
- Place a rubber band around each closed shoe box and drop off at the Information Center by November 13

GIFT IDEAS:

TOYS— Small cars, balls, dolls, stuffed animals, kazoos, harmonicas, yo-yos, jump ropes, small Etch A Sketch, toys that light up or make noise (with extra batteries), Slinky, etc.

SCHOOL SUPPLIES-Pens, pencils & sharpener, crayons or markers, stamps and ink pad sets, writing pads or paper, solar calculators, coloring and picture books, etc.

HYGIENE ITEMS-Toothbrush, toothpaste, mild bar soap (in a plastic bag), comb, washcloth, etc.

OTHER-Hard candy and lollipops (please double bag all candy), mints, gum, T-shirts, socks, ball caps; sunglasses, hair clips, toy jewelry, watches, flashlights (with extra batteries)

A PERSONAL NOTE— In a separate envelope, you may enclose a note to the child and a photo of yourself or your family. (If you include your name & address, the child may write back.)

DO NOT INCLUDE-Used or damaged items; war-related items such as toy guns, knives or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow

globes or glass container; aerosol cans.


