This December we enjoyed one of the most revitalizing Christmas music seasons in recent memory. The story of the magi challenges me to consider my priorities in worship. The Bible tells us that they travelled a great distance to get to Bethlehem. And, when they entered the house and saw Jesus with Mary, they fell to the ground and began to worship Him. The richest of gifts were given to this newborn King.

Jesus alone merits the focus of my worship. These learned men came with a singular focus: worship of Jesus. They had talked with Herod. The mother of Jesus was present. Many others no doubt had crossed their path on the journey to Bethlehem. But when they saw the star they began their journey to find Jesus. And, having found Him, worshiped. Let my worship have a singular focus. I do not come to be entertained, to be flattered, to socialize, or to feel better about myself. There may be a time and place for those things, but not when I come to worship. Worship is all about Jesus.

I will likely have to overcome some obstacles to worship, but if I persevere it will be worth it. The Bible does not tell us how far the magi travelled, but we know it was a considerable distance. Not only did they have to travel several miles, they were not certain of their destination. But to see Jesus, they had to take the trip. My obstacles seem to range from petty (the temperature is not quite right), to distractions (a rambunctious child), or even deeply spiritual (my sin quenches the Spirit). Yet, if I want to see Jesus I will have overcome each struggle. I will confess my sin, pray for the child (and the parents!), ignore the temperature, and address every stumbling block.

Jesus deserves my best. The wise men brought gifts for a king and Jesus rightfully deserved to receive them. He deserves my best, too. May I reject offering Him half-hearted, religious ceremony and choose instead to present all that I have and am, engaging my body, mind, and spirit with complete abandon as I give Jesus my best.

I invite you to consider your priorities in worship. Will you join me in a commitment of renewed worship? Let us come together and worship King Jesus.
