WORLD MISSION PRAYER EMPHASIS

In a country famous for its cuisine, Jim and Becky Bricker offer an original flavor: tabletop evangelism. "This is a phrase I coined to describe our witness to Muslims after we share a meal together," Jim says.

The Brickers, missionaries to France in Muslim evangelism, live in Toulouse. They find Muslim immigrants very willing to talk about spiritual matters. They distribute the Bread of Life (French and Arabic New Testaments) from their "book nook" in an outdoor Muslim market. This ministry has borne fruit in a small cell church where many Muslims attend a Christian church for the first time. "We've see five Arabs baptized - a thrill beyond words," Jim says. Arab converts need much prayer for their growth and protection as they face great difficulties from their families and other Muslims.

Prayer for the Bricker children is vital. Joy, 6, and Samuel, 7, are growing up in an educational system that is hostile toward Christianity. Jim stresses the importance of prayer for all their missions work. "Some of the frustration of living and ministering in France is that the vast majority of the French are resistant to the gospel. And that 'nut' will be cracked only by an outpouring of God's spirit as God's people humble themselves and pray and seek His face. Please pray for a spiritual awakening in France."

Desperately you search the courtroom for a defense attorney, but there is no sign of one. As the accuser continues his rampage, you sink lower into your seat, knowing that what he says is true and that judgment is not far away. You sense a break in the onslaught as the accuser looks at you and says, "The prosecution rests!" Your heart drops with a thud that you swear echoes throughout the courtroom, and all eyes turn toward the Judge.

With compassionate eyes the One behind the bench looks at you. He pauses for a minute and then begins to speak. "I have taken into account all that has been presented here today. I have heard all of the prosecution's arguments, and have weighed the consequences of the actions of the defendant. "The wages of these sins is death." Your whole insides begin to melt! Then you hear the unbelievable, or is it? "But, this one, the defendant, belongs to me." The prosecutor objects, but it is too late for that. The Judge continues, "His sin and his death have already been taken care of by my Son on a cross." "I love this one. He is mine."


