

SCHOLAR TO SPEAK THIS SUNDAY

Dr. Herschel Hobbs, Scholar, Author and Teacher, will speak at First Baptist this Sunday, through the media of the videocassette. This will be the first of a series of the discussion of basic Baptist Doctrines by Dr. Hobbs. The convenor and moderator for each session will be David Moore. David reports that Dr. Hobbs gives a thorough presentation of each subject. This will not be "Baby Baptist Basics".

These sessions by the "Founding Father" of The Baptist Faith and Message will meet in the Fellowship Hall each week at 6:00 p.m. Study course credit will be given to those who attend these sessions and read the book "The Baptist Faith and Message".

The first session will center on:

THE SCRIPTURES

The Holy Bible was written by men divinely inspired and is the record of God's revelation of Himself to man. It is a perfect treasure of divine instruction. It has God for its author, salvation for its end, and truth, without any mixture of error, for its matter. It reveals the principles by which God judges us; and therefore is, and will remain to the end of the world, the true center of Christian union, and the supreme standard by which all human conduct, creeds, and religious opinions should be tried. The criterion by which the Bible is to be interpreted is Jesus Christ.

1899: Grading system for organizing missionary societies is adopted.

1903: Week of Self-Denial becomes Week of Prayer and Special Effort for Home Missions.

WMU inaugurates Church Building and Loan Fund for the Home Mission Board.

TURN OF CENTURY

1905: WMU establishes Margaret Home in Greenville, SC, for children of missionaries.

1906: First Week of Prayer for State Missions. WMU assumes the publishing of missions literature for the churches. Our Mission Fields magazine is begun.
