Monday's "Northwest Arkansas Times" printed an article on the new hundred dollar bill that began "A new \$100 bill with a bigger, off-center picture of Benjamin Franklin and several innovations to thwart counterfeiters goes into circulation around the world today."

The point of the story is the "Fed" is printing a hundred dollar bill that is impossible to counterfeit and will become the leading medium of monetary currency throughout the world. The article states "Russia has an especially big demand for the new bills, since cash is popular as a hedge against the huge inflation of rubles. The Russian central bank estimates that \$12 billion to \$13 billion in American currency already circulates in the country, making it the biggest user of U.S. currency abroad." Also, the piece goes on to point out that modern technology is proficient enough that almost anyone is able to duplicate American currency. It's so valuable throughout the world that dishonest people profit from counterfeiting it. (I wish I had a bunch of the real bills.)

After reading the story, I can't help thinking of our priceless inheritance that will never be counterfeited. Peter states that our salvation 'can never perish, spoil or fade--kept in heaven for you.' Paul writes to the believers in Ephesus, 'And God raised us up with Christ and seated us with him in the heavenly realms in Christ Jesus, in order that in the coming ages he might show the incomparable riches of his grace, ....I became a servant of this gospel by the gift of God's grace given me through the working of his power...to preach to the Gentiles the unsearchable riches of Christ...' (Ephesians 2:6,7;3:7,8)

It seems to me this is the reason for our "Find Us Faithful" campaign. We will be asked to pledge our hundred dollar bills for Fayetteville's First Baptist to use the facilities as a means to reach and disciple people who will proclaim the unsearchable riches of Christ. Therefore, the Gospel of God's grace will circulate throughout the world. "Now it is required that those who have been given a trust must prove faithful." (1Cor. 4:2)


