The Property Evaluation Committee

The Property Evaluation Committee of First Baptist Church was elected by the church for the purpose of evaluating the property along Highland Street and making recommendations concerning it. On January 20, 1991, the committee reported that a study of specific needs for additional space needed to be made. The church voted at that time for the committee to conduct such a study and report back.

This committee has met and discussed the needs of the church. They have talked with members of the church individually and in Sunday School opening assemblies of the Adult Departments. They have talked with leaders of various organizations of the church. They studied the recent "We Are Family" questionnaire done in our Sunday School and a survey done with our deacons and church council. They also invited any interested people to attend a meeting April 7, 1991, to allow for further input by members of the congregation.

As a result of all of this, the committee believes the church, as a whole, is interested in addressing two specific problems: 1) the need for parking, 2) the need for additional Sunday School space for Preschoolers, Children, Youth, and Adults, additional space for all-church fellowship functions, additional space for library and media, additional space for music ministry, and space for recreation for all ages of the church.

The committee met last Sunday afternoon, April 14, 1991, for further discussion. In that meeting the specific needs for new preschool space, along with the need for a larger fellowship hall, was highlighted.

Therefore, believing that God is leading and that many of the congregation agree, the committee will present the following recommendation at the regular monthly business meeting, April 21, 1991, 8:00 p.m.

"We recommend that the church elect a Building Committee and authorize them to interview architects and employ one to prepare a preliminary design for a multi-use building."

The new committee will be responsible for using the data the Property Evaluation Committee has gathered and recommendations of the staff in determining specific square footage and use.
