It has only happened to me once before in a church trip, and at the time I was a teenager going to youth camp. We were traveling down I-20 going from Dallas towards Tyler, Texas when that now unmistakable noise occurred. It was sort of a repeated thud-like sound. It was definitely a sound that said something was wrong. It was a flat tire.

Well, all who went to Six Flags this past weekend will now, ten years down the line, get to tell the same type of church trip story. I do not write about this to belittle any tire dealer, to say anything about Oklahoma roads, or to lobby for more money to improve the capability of our vans. I write this to tell you about God's faithfulness.

This is how it happened. We were just north of Durant, Oklahoma when the repeated thud-like sound happened. I immediately pulled to the side of the road. After our first examination we thought we had just run over something because all of the tires were still inflated, but on a second glance I noticed that one of the back tires no longer had tread on it. We got back into the van and pulled up to a small gravel road that led up to some type of machine or engine shop. I asked all of the students to get out of the van and proceeded to get the spare tire out. It was then that God showed us that He had been in control all of the time.

I never thought that God would send His helpers dressed in wranglers, plaid cowboy shirts, and speaking in a severe southern drawl. But He

As I searched feverishly to find any type of equipment to help change the tire, two large country gentlemen walked over from the machine shop. After commenting on the trouble we seemed to be in they revealed that they had a floor jack and an air gun and would be more than willing to change our tire for us. Well, that is exactly what happened. They had us out of there within ten minutes and we were on our way to have a great time in the great state of Texas.

God was faithful to provide for our needs that day. He knew where we would break down. He knew that those men would be there to help us. And as we left we offered up a prayer of thanksgiving and praised God for His faithfulness and protection.

Joshua 1:9 says, "Have I not commanded you? Do not be terrified; do not be discouraged, for the Lord your God will be with wherever you go." This still rings true today. Even when dealing with flat tires.
