TWO REQUESTS FOR WORKERS IN THE HARVEST

First Request - Sunday School Leadership- The Nominating Committee is in the process of enlisting leadership for the new Sunday School year. We are in great need of preschool/children's leadership. The Children's Division needs two children's directors and three teachers. The Preschool Division needs two director's and at least one teacher. Children are important to the kingdom of God. Jesus told His disciples to "let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them, for the kingdom of heaven belongs to such as these." Our church must have leadership to minister to precious children. Please pray about your place of service and contact the church office.

Second Request - Extra Office Help - We have found a way to contact everyone who moves to a new residence in Fayetteville. According to our information, at least 125 new residents move in our city each week. We don't know if the new resident is just moving within our city to one place from another, or if they are moving to Fayetteville for the first time. We just know they have moved. We have a plan to mail every new resident some information about our church along with an opportunity to respond. We hope to discover about thirty-five to forty prospect families per month. The need is for someone to volunteer to work in the church office about four hours each week. This volunteer will type at least 124 addresses of new residents per week. Each month we will mail a special mail-out to the new residents. Again, contact the church office if you will help in discovering families in need of a witness or ministry of the church.

SANCTUARY CHOIR: Our Sanctuary Choir is made up of some very committed people. In every church I've served the service choir for the morning service comprised of adults (and in some smaller situations, youth as well) has represented a microcosm of the church at large. No where has this been more true than here at Fayetteville's First Baptist

Our choir is made up of teachers, deacons, committee members, discipleship training leaders, youth workers, and mission minded folks. The diversity seen in our church, is mirrored in the choir. The faithfulness of our church membership is reflected in the choir's consistantly good attendance. All three summers of my tenure here, our Sanctuary Choir has consistently had an attendance equal to or greater than that of the church as a whole, proportionally. I appreciate these people, not only for their dedication, commitment to serve, and willingness to meet a challenge, but also for their desire for excellence. It inspires me and motivates me to grow personally, both in the spiritual and musical realms.

Some of you have considered being a part of the choir. However, for some reason or another, you feel its not a place for you. Let me encourage you to prayerfully reconsider that idea. Our Sanctuary Choir is a family of church members, each with varying degrees of musical talent, training, and aptitude, unified by their love for the Lord, His church, and the desire to see Him glorified, the church built up, and the lost reached through music. Each of us bring something different to the effort. Collectively, like the church, we are able to accomplish much more than we could singly, with each of us receiving far more than we bring.

Our present Sanctuary Choir enrollment is somewhere around 63. That number should be much closer to 75. If it were, our weekly average attendance of 40-42 would rise considerably. Our loft quite comfortably seats 52 in its present format. There is room for up to 60. To reach that maximum level in the loft, with our present enrollment to attendance ratio, we would need to have 88 people enrolled. You might help us toward that goal. Will you prayerfully consider it?






