
Thank you to all who made the "Midnight Madness" training marathon a success.

Now that Promotion Sunday and Leadership Training are behind us, the next emphasis is outreach. Please allow me to mention two methods of outreach.

First, we hope to organize two more Andrew Clubs. Andrew clubs are a most effective means of personal visitation. The basic idea of an Andrew club is members visit prospects for about an hour and a half. After visitation, they gather in a home of a member for food, fellowship and reports. Members take turns hosting the group. The club meets one time per month. Presently, we have two clubs functioning. With four clubs visiting on separate weeks, this makes sure that there is personal visitation each week. Of course, the Sunday School departments should visit prospects the following week who have attended worship or Bible study for the first time. If you are interested in joining an Andrew club, please contact the church office.

Second, all-church outreach is scheduled for Sunday evening, September 29. We will endeavor to accomplish more than prospect visitation [which is very important.] We will encourage Sunday School departments to distribute literature to their members who haven't attended Bible study since Promotion Sunday. Absentees need to know they are important and that we miss them. We need your help!

It is a night which provides opportunity for the congregation to sing carols they request, and for members to share readings or stories of a spiritual nature that have touched their lives as a part of their Christmas experience. 
