



I came across these quotes from "NetFax," an information and church research service of Leadership Network. "The search for spirituality is one of the deepest issues in present day U. S. culture. Many people are simply empty at the core. Soul care means paying attention to what is happening in people's lives 'below the water line' where they really live. One hears people, especially Boomers, talk a lot about 'running on empty' and trying to find balance in their lives... The U. 


