


THE DROUGHT IN SOUTHERN AFRICA HAS BEEN ONE OF THE worst in many years. Some estimates have placed the grain needed at over 12 million tons, more than the amount of food aid given last year in the whole world.


To the north, Somalians are starving to death at the rate of 2,000 a week and more. Five million people are believed in danger of starvation.

Drought problems have been greatly compounded by anarchy following the overflow of the Somalian president in January 1991. The United States government is planning emergency food drops to Somalians worth an estimated \$200 million and has developed a plan to help jump-start the Somalian economy.

In our own country, chronic homelessness and hunger are realities in

rural Appalachia, in the inner city of Chicago and in other major cities. The destruction of Hurricane Andrew has left thousands more without homes or food.

Our church family can do something about world hunger. The monies you give will be sent through the state convention office to the Foreign and Home Mission Boards for World Hunger. One hundred percent of the money will be used for world hunger. There will be envelopes in the pews on Sunday, October 11, for this purpose. Whatever your plan, the need is urgent.


occurs during the worship service time.


SENIOR ADULT DUTING




October is "Outreach Month" leading up to "Good News Sunday" November 1, 1992.


