

A SIMPLE AND HONEST EXPLANATION OF WHAT THE BIBLE SAYS about getting into Heaven will be the topic on November 1st.


Dr. David B. Davis, a former member of the Fellowship of Christian Athletes, will be speaking at both morning and evening worship services.

Davis is a graduate of Southwestern Baptist Theological Seminary in Fort Worth, Texas. He lettered in varsity football, baseball and track at East Central University in Ada, Oklahoma, and still holds the national rushing record for a single game by a quarterback with 294 yards.

He is a full-time Southern Baptist Evangelist having preached in over 600 Southern Baptist churches all across our nation.

His book, "Surviving as a Teenager", has over 75,000 copies in circulation, and has helped parents and students deal with problems such as peer pressure, reasons why teens use drugs and alcohol and commit suicide, and other related issues of life.

I'll look for you this Sunday in Sunday School.


