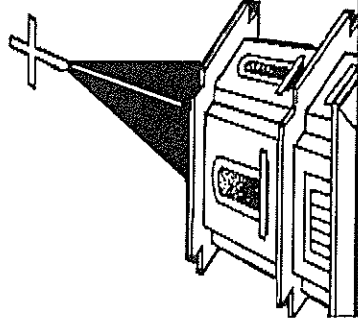

November 15th:

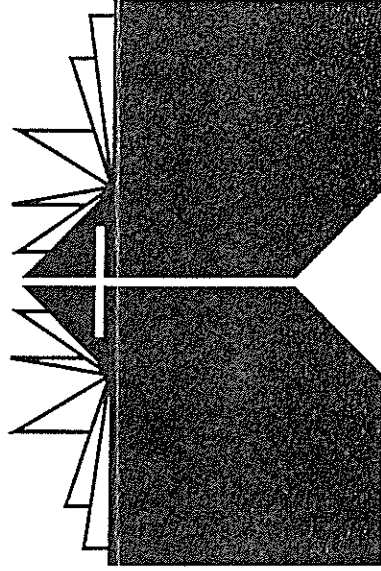
Further discussion of proposal in the Business Meeting at 7:00 p.m.

Clean-Sweep

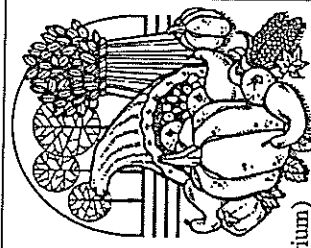

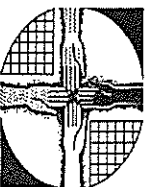
