WHEREAS, Jesus taught that such catastrophes should call the people to repentance (Luke 13:1-5);

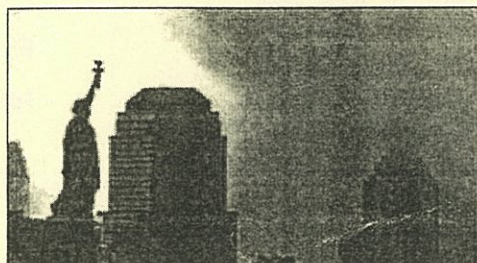

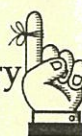

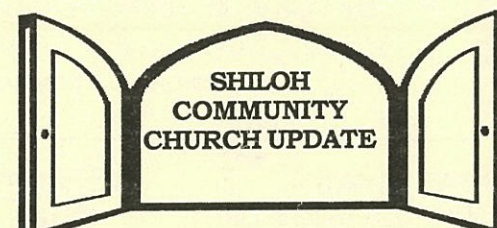

HABITAT FOR HUMANITY OF FAYETTEVILLE



has completed 14 houses and is in the process of building 3 more. The 15th house, now under construction, is for Christine Sloan and her 5 sons. Christine is a single mother with full custody of her sons since 1995.

She has a full time job at Danaher Tool Group. Christine must invest 400 hours of "sweat equity" and a \$1,000 deposit to qualify for her home.

Habitat has a family selection process, and Christine and her sons were chosen over several other families. The committees felt she was the most deserving and also, demonstrated the willingness to continue providing for the boys. She had a record of good credit, working continually, and asking for help only on rare occasions. The committee's unannounced visits proved she was caring for her home and sons in a responsible way.

Habitat builds homes for low-income families with interest free mortgages. Habitat helps people help themselves. We, also, teach the families how to be good neighbors, how to handle their finances and how to keep their homes in good repair. There are several committees that meet with the families and, through instructions, help them to make good decisions in regard to their everyday life. We encourage families to choose a local church and to become involved. Some have taken our suggestion, and others have not.

Habitat for Humanity could not accomplish the program we have set for this community and the families without the help of the several people. Churches have agreed to work on certain days, and their help is greatly needed. The houses would cost a great deal more if volunteers did not come on those days, and our suppliers did not donate material and labor, also.

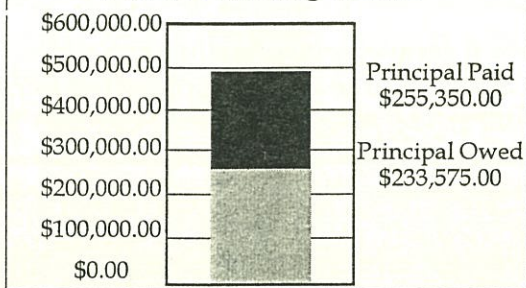
