

I am so thankful that He died knowing that I was aware of his deep love for me and that he returned that love. In time, I realized that though his presence in my life and the lives of those I love had been cut short, his godly influence would live on in us, enriching our lives for years to come. It has. And with the passing years, the pain has diminished as those memories, once so painful, have slowly became a comfort and are now only rarely bitter-

My Dad was a great teacher. Of the many lessons he taught me. I think the final one is one of the most important: life is fleeting and we act wisely, gaining immortality here on earth only as we invest our brief time here in the lives of others. The sound of our voice, our physical appearance, our personalities are bound for extinction. Godly living alone lasts beyond our allotted span on earth, as it touches other lives generations to come.

Thanks, Dad. No only did you make the right choice in how you lived, but through your model you also taught me how to live more wisely. I miss you still, I always will; yet you are still very much alive in my life.

Finally, we will need help with the New Year's Eve Blast. We have

tentatively reserved the Jones Center in Springdale and could expect up to 100-200 students to be involved in this event. We will need sponsors to drive our students to the event and to stay at the lock-in all night with them. This event is still in the works, so I'll get more information to you as soon as I receive it. If you would be willing to sponsor this event, please give me a call.

Please make these requests a matter of prayer. I will be praying for you as well. I know that God desires to raise up more adults who will invest their lives into the lives of teens to help them come to know Christ and grow in their relationship with Him. 


