
It's a great American tradition: a victory parade. Last month the New York Yankees baseball team was honored with a "ticker tape" parade to celebrate their world series victory. [Adoring fans dumped 200 tons of confetti during that parade.] In Atlanta, Eveander Hollyfield was given a huge parade for his miraculous heavy weight boxing championship victory over Mike Tyson. Usually the victorious athlete[s], astronaut, soldier, or politician [President Harry Truman was honored with a New York "ticker tape" parade in 1945] sits astride a convertible as it rolls through the downtown area of a large city. The hero[s] waves and smiles to adoring throngs as jubilant fans express their tribute and admiration. Yes, a victory parade is quite an exciting event.

The ancient Romans had a cultural equivalent to the parade. They called it a "triumph." When a military hero returned victorious from a great war, the senate would vote him such a celebration. Amidst the blaring of trumpets and beating of drums, the troops would strut down the street on the way to a huge ceremony that honored the victors. Behind the troops, in the place of honor, rode the conquering military hero in a horse-drawn chariot. Ahead would be cartloads of spoils of war, and chained to the chariot were the captive leaders of the defeated army.

Paul uses this image in 2 Corinthians 2:14. He places Christ in the victor's chariot and we [and all Christians] are His bond slaves walking beside the chariot. The great apostle argues that the Christian life is a parade to the glory of Jesus, in which we serve as living symbols of the power of His love. As we celebrate the Thanksgiving and Christmas seasons, we should smile and wave to the crowd. Remember, we are walking witnesses to the greatness of the One who has conquered this old world. He has won the victory over death and gives us the matchless gift of eternal life. In the meantime, we enjoy the abundant blessings of being in His parade.


