
"Basically, all of us, whether insiders or outsiders, start out in identical conditions, which is to say that we all start out as sinners." (Romans 3:9-10, The Message).



We all wanted to know our baby's gender. "We can't be 100% accurate," the doc said, "but I'd say 99 to 1 he's a boy." Through the amazing marvels of modern technology we watched the doctor check head size, brain development, heart function, spinal and umbilical cords, kidneys, and bone structure. It was like meeting my new son shead of time.

I remember well the night Justin was born. The first time he cried I thought, "That's a sound I've never heard before and yet it has an indescribable familiarity. It's saying, 'I'm your firstborn, the first creature you had a part in making, and I belong to no other man but you." It was thrilling! But, Tim's birth was no less exciting. Being an *only child*, I remember thinking, "You look so much like your brother did when he came, and yet the way you move, the sound of your voice; it's so obvious that you are a completely different personality, a totally unique individual, a brand new creation." Boy, was that an understatement! What a joy it has been to experience siblinghood vicariously through my sons. And now I am to have another. What a privilege. What a blessing. I am so humbled.

Saturday evening, at the invitation of some our friends, we attended First Baptist, Springdale's living Christmas tree. As a father-to-be once more, I couldn't help but identify with Joseph. How must he have felt? To experience on the one hand the pride and joy of any father at the birth of his firstborn, and yet to know on the other that Jesus was really not his flesh, blood, and bone. What a special man he had to have been to deal with such ambivalent emotions. And can you imagine being chosen by God to be the earthly father of God? What an awesome privilege. What a glorious blessing! And yet how humbling.

I was grappling with these thoughts and feelings when suddenly they were swept away by others. As I looked at the tiny baby boy, portraying baby Jesus, I asked

myself, "What kind of God do we worship?"

Now that I've seen his face, I can hardly wait for the birth of my new son. I wonder, "Will he be more like Justin or more like Tim, a combination of the two, or something entirely new?" So many have said, "This baby will be a special blessing; you'll enjoy it far more than you have your other two." Maybe that will be true, but it's extremely hard to believe. Could there really be more than what I've already enjoyed? I can't imagine it! But I'll just have to wait and see. After all, I'm just a earthly father, limited in my knowledge. Yet think of it, God knew/knows all things!

What did *He* feel the night His Son was born? Unlike mortal fathers, He knew all that would follow: the journey to Egypt, a boy's hands learning the carpenter's trade in Nazareth, the teenager baffling rabbis in the temple, miraculous wine in Cana, stilled storms on the Sea of Galilee, blind eyes opened, corpses called back to life, shouts of *Hosanna!* Unlike me, He knew the beginning and the end of His Son's earthly life — the manger... and the cross. Yet... He let Him come anyway.

I have a loving heart. I would like to believe that I could give up my life for you. But don't ask me to give up my sons, not any one of the three. It's too dear a price. They're mine! Flesh of my flesh, blood of my blood, bone of my bone.

I love them too much!

Debbie McCord works quietly. But that doesn't mean she's an ineffective missionary in Seoul, South Korea.


"I'm very comfortable being a homemaker who reaches out in my neighborhood," Debbie explains. She stays busy with daughter Mindy, 14, and son Matt, 10, as well as church activities. But during school hours she does her main outreach ministry: evangelism through hospitality. Debbie opens her home to Korean women in the neighborhood, building relationships that lead to invitations to their homes. One friend, Mrs. Ahn, wasn't a Christian when she moved nearby. Now she is, through Debbie's ministry of friendship, and so are her children, "I hope the day will come when her husband will know the Lord, too," Debbie adds, asking for prayer for him.

As a preacher's kid, Debbie grew up hearing about missions in Sunbeams and GA. Her call to missions came after her high school graduation. Later she served as a journeyman in South Korea. She returned there in 1982 with her husband, Steve, as a career missionary.

Debbie says her greatest challenge is balance. Family, neighbors, and church vie for her time and witness. She tries to be all God wants her to be in her relationships with everyone.
