#### **Note from Norm**

In the bleak midwinter,
Frosty wind made moan,
Earth stood hard as iron,
Water like a stone;
Snow had fallen, snow on snow,
Snow on snow,
In the bleak midwinter, Long ago.

Christina Rossetti wrote the words to one of my favorite Christmas hymns, *In the Bleak Midwinter*. Christina authored three collections of mostly religious poetry and four devotional books and she came from a family steeped in the arts. Her deep faith is thought to be partially from the comfort that she found in writing as a result of her poor health from age sixteen. Her most famous hymns texts are "Love Came Down at Christmas" and "In the Bleak Midwinter." In the Bleak Midwinter first published as the poem "A Christmas Carol" in *Scribner's Monthly* in January 1872. It first appeared as a hymn in *The English Hymnal* (1906), where it was paired to a tune by the famous English composer Gustav Holst.

As Michael Hawn notes, the first memorable stanza, Rossetti creates a dreary and desolate image of the world into which the infant Jesus appeared. She is not suggesting that it literally snowed in Bethlehem, but is drawing on a long -established literary idea of associating snow with Christ's birth. The famous 17<sup>th</sup> century poet, John Milton, used the winter imagery in his poem, "On the Morning of Christ's Nativity," as a pure covering to hide the sin of the world. Rossetti exploits this metaphor in the opposite way. The Incarnate One, the Light of the World, brought warmth into the most forlorn and dreary of sinful situations. The second stanza uses the device of antithesis to make the point that the eternal One whom "heaven could not hold" nor "earth sustain" appeared during the "bleak winter" of human existence where "a stable place sufficed."

The final stanza is perhaps one of the most endearing:

What can I give him, Poor as I am? If I were a shepherd, I would bring a lamb; If I were a wise man, I would do my part; Yet what I can I give him; Give my heart.

When a woman wrote these words, women were largely excluded. Like the shepherds; she was not employed; like the wisemen, Rossetti had no degree. The writer invites us to offer our own gift to the Christ Child just as the shepherds and wisemen did. Rather than the present of a lamb or expensive gifts, however, we offer the most important gift- our hearts.

Advent can be filled with worry about finding the perfect Christmas gifts. Deep down we want people in our lives to know they are special and that we love them. But sometimes we overlook the greatest gift of all... our very presence. The last verse reminds us that even if we are feeling poor — in resources, in body or spirit — we can simply be a gift of presence, we can give our hearts. This season, we are invited to be the gift of presence for our loved ones, for our communities, for those who need it most. Join us this December for our worship series *The Gift of Being Present* as we unwrap with anticipation the gift that God will reveal.




# You're Invited.... To the Big Reveal!
