## Go to Hell

As we wrap up our series on the Apostle's Creed this month, I thought I'd use the newsletter to share a word about a phrase from the Creed we don't actually include when we recite it from our hymnal. Historically, the 4<sup>th</sup> Century Creed included the phrase "**he descended into hell**" when describing Jesus. The heart of Christianity is focused on a three day drama, and at the center of it is an empty day. The Gospels tell us nothing about what happened to Jesus on what we refer to as Holy Saturday (between burial and resurrection). And yet, I thought it might be worth sharing some insight on the phrase from UM pastor James Howell:

We know hell is not some cavern so many meters below the earth's surface that spits fire and is patrolled by guys with pitchforks. But the doctrine of Christ's decent into hell isn't a travelogue, but a metaphor, a window into the truth of God's heart that transcends space and time. Jesus cannot bear for his beloved to be lost. William Barclay says: "This doctrine means symbolically that either in this life or in life beyond death all are offered the gospel of truth and the love of God. There are no limits in space and time through the grace of God. God has an eternity." God continues to pursue us even beyond death itself.... As Christians, whatever we believe about hell and its future citizenship, we have absolutely no option but to hope passionately for, to pray zealously for the salvation of every person, and to grieve over the idea that even one might perish.

Here is something that seems undebatable: If Jesus descended to hell, we are called to follow him there.... Hell is not merely on the far side of the grave. Maybe we will never get very close to Christ until we launch out on an itinerary to visit a few more hells. Go to Morocco or Haiti where thousands have been killed in earthquakes. Go to the West Bank and Gaza where children don't go out of the house, except it's not safe inside either as buildings are shelled. Go to Kenya where AIDS ravages the population... Sit in the waiting room with the parents whose pediatrician just announced their daughter has a brain tumor. Visit your neighbor whose depression shackles him to a chair; or look across the dining room table at the one you love but cannot quite understand.

Christ descended into hell. Thank God. "If the Lord had not been on our side, we would have been swallowed whole" (Ps 124:2). And the same Jesus who descends to every branch establishment of hell on earth asks us to follow him, not at a safe distance but up close… Just as Jesus invaded the devil's lair, so we dare to insert ourselves into places and situations that seem godless. But because Jesus descended into hell, we know there is no such thing as a godless place. Whenever we as the Church go to hell, we find that Jesus is there ahead of us, and we discover that we at long last are actually close to the Jesus for whom we long… You may not get credit for going; no one may be watching, but then no one could see Jesus on that Friday night and dismal Saturday. The closer we stay to Jesus, the more we love those he loved, the more we find ourselves in ugly places — which are no longer ugly, for Christ is there.


