# Following Jesus: A Way of Life - Together

As a church, we have spent the past month reflecting in worship what it means to follow Jesus: not only as individuals, but as a way of life. We've been reminded that discipleship is both personal and communal. Each of us is called to live faithfully day by day, but we are also called to live faithfully together as the body of Christ.

This year has brought tremendous change and challenge. The parsonage was condemned due to the effects of hurricane Helene, we experienced a pastoral transition, we said goodbye to a music director, and we've walked through seasons of financial strain. These are not small things, and I want to acknowledge the weight they carry. At the same time, I believe that even in the midst of challenges, God is doing something new. I see new sprouts of life emerge each day in the way you are caring for one another, showing up to serve, and people agreeing to use their gifts to serve. These things reveal God stirring in our midst. Scripture reminds us that God can use every circumstance to shape and guide His people for His purposes.

Now is a season for us to recognize God at work in our midst and realign ourselves with God's direction—not just as individuals, but as a congregation. Who are we called to be in this community? What needs around us require the hands and feet of Jesus? Where is God leading us in the days ahead? These are questions we cannot answer alone. They require prayer, conversation, and a willingness to listen deeply to God and to one another.

To help us discern our next steps, I have planned a **Vision Planning Gathering** on **Sunday, October 12th, 12:00-2:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall**. This will be a time for church leaders to gather, assess where we are, dream together, and seek God's wisdom for our shared ministry. It is not just a meeting—it is a moment of prayerful listening and hopeful imagining.

I ask you, as the congregation, to begin praying now:

- Pray for clarity as we discern God's direction.
- Pray for courage to step into new opportunities.
- Pray for unity as we seek to follow Jesus together.

Following Jesus is indeed a way of life. And the beautiful truth is, we don't walk this way alone. We walk it together—with one another, and with Christ who goes before us.

Let us continue forward with hope, trust, and open hearts, believing that God will guide us into the next chapter of our life together.


Every two seconds, someone in the U.S. needs blood, such as accident and burn victims!

# **Backpack Information**

The goal of the backpack program is to send food to supplement families on the weekends.

The Backpack Ministry is currently serving families from Salem Elementary and North Liberty schools. We have 11 families with a total of 25 children.

We pack 50 breakfast and plus 22 lunch & 22 supper items include individual grits, cereal and breakfast include granola bars, Jello, snack cakes, pudding includes dried fruit and



50 snack items a week items weekly. Breakfast servings of oatmeal, bars. Snack items also individually wrapped fruit cups and cans. Lunch cookies. Supper items

include canned vegetables, canned pasta, ramen noodles, canned and dried soups, boxed pasta, hamburger helper, tuna, spam, canned stew, stuffing, imitation potatoes, and mac and cheese.
