

The Prayer of Jabez

During my message a few weeks ago, I shared how one of our recent Sunday School classes made my prayer time more complete and impactful. Debbie Johnson taught a class called "Pray First", and it was based on a study written by Chris Hodges, the founder and senior pastor of the Church of the Highlands. If this class ever comes

around again, I would highly recommend that you take it and soak it all in!

Essentially, the book discusses different models of prayer that we can take from scripture and pray over our own lives and circumstances. But what I love most about these models is that they keep us focused on what is most important in prayer. They are not chances for us to go to God and tell Him a list of what we want, which is what prayer can easily become. They keep our focus on worshipping Him, acknowledging and submitting to His will, and giving our needs over to His thoughtful, powerful authority.

The prayer model that stood out to me the most was the Prayer of Jabez. You can find this prayer in 1 Chronicles 4:9-10. Scripture does not have a lot to say about him, but the prayer that he offers is simple and profound. Chris notes that he prays for blessing, influence, presence, and protection.

When we pray for blessing, it is not simply for possessions or wealth. We are praying that God would bless our lives with His supernatural riches so that we can be a light for Him. Like Pastor Steve often says, "Lord, bless me so I can be a blessing to others!" When we pray for influence, we are asking God to help us use what He has blessed us with to make a difference for Him and His kingdom. Next, we pray for

Jabez cried out to the God of Israel, "Oh, that you would bless me and enlarge my territory! Let your hand be with me, and keep me from harm so that I will be free from pain." And God granted his request.

1 Chronicles 4:10

God's presence. As we are blessed by God and given influence over what He has entrusted to us, inevitably, we will be humbled as we realize our need for His presence in our lives more and more. Lastly, we pray for protection. As we dive into the callings that God has placed on our lives, we will need God's protection from every attack of the enemy.

It seems fitting that we should practice using this model and pray over our church.

Dear Lord, today we lift up Mt. Zion to you. We pray that you would bless our people and our church in every area of ministry. As we receive these blessings, may we use them to influence those in our community. May we have a unified purpose of bringing those around us to you by whatever means you provide. When we engage in this calling, give us your presence. Walk with us through trials and strengthen us during each hurdle. Lastly, we pray for your protection. Protect our ministry and our calling and our faith as we fight for your kingdom to prevail. Thank you, Jesus, for using us in such beautiful ways. Amen.
