# **Lottie Moon**

Lottie Moon (1840–1912) was a Southern Baptist missionary to China who devoted nearly 40 years to spreading the gospel and serving the Chinese people. She is one of the most influential figures in Southern Baptist mission history. Lottie passionately advocated for more missionary support and giving, writing letters that inspired Southern Baptists back home to become more involved in international missions.

Her legacy led to the creation of the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering in 1918, which continues today as the primary way Southern Baptists fund international mission work through the International Mission Board (IMB). Since 1888, Southern Baptists have raised almost 2 billion dollars for foreign missions.

Each December, Southern Baptists join together to give through the Lottie Moon Christmas Offering, supporting missionaries around the world. Will you prayerfully consider giving this year?
