14. FALSE (Both Catholics and Protestants believe that Christ was 100% human and 100% divine, and these two natures are without separation, conversion, mixture, or confusion, cf. Rom. 9:5; 1 Tim. 3:16)
15. TRUE (John 3:16; Rom. 3:25-26)
16. FALSE (Christ's offices were prophet, priest, and king. He is a prophet – Luke 24:19; Deut. 18:5 with Acts 3:22; Matt. 21:46; Luke 7:16; Heb. 1:1-2. He is a priest – Heb. 7:23-28; Rom. 8:26, 34. He is a king – Matt. 21:5; 2 Sam. 7:16; Is. 9:6-7; Rev. 19:16.)
17. TRUE (Justification – Rom. 3:22. Sanctification – Rom. 6:19; Phil. 1:6)
18. FALSE (Rom. 3:28)
19. FALSE (1 John 2:1-2)
20. FALSE (All true believers have been baptized by the Spirit – 1 Cor. 12:13)
21. TRUE (Eph. 4:30)
22. TRUE (James 4:8)
23. FALSE (1 Cor. 15:42-55)
24. TRUE (Luke 23:42-43; Phil. 1:22-23; 2 Cor. 5:8)
25. FALSE. Upon putting our faith in Jesus Christ, he forgives our sins and imputes His righteousness to us, with the result that God declares us righteous. (Rom. 3:21-22)
