ABOUT OUR CHRISMON TREE!

Chrismons were first developed in 1957 by Mrs. Frances Spencer of Lutheran Ascension Church in Virginia. In an effort to create appropriate decorations for her church Christmas tree, Spencer fashioned centuries-old symbols into white and gold tree ornaments. 'Chrismon" is a combination of the words "Christ" and "monogram," and means "symbols of Christ." Chrismons are gold and white, representing majesty and purity. Ideas for fashioning are developed from early Christian symbols, the Bible, and church

histories.

Although Chrismons have been used in the United States since 1957, many symbols of Christianity have come down to us through the ages. Early Christians often worshiped in secret to avoid possible persecution and death. They developed certain symbols that were used to communicate with fellow believers and direct Christians to secret places of worship. Symbols that signify the believers' faith often adorned doors and buildings. The lighting of the Chrismon tree often is incorporated with the hanging of the greens in some churches.

As we begin this Advent Season, come see this beautiful tree with the symbols of our season that remind us of our Lord's mercy and grace. Alpha and Omega: The first and the last of the Greek alphabet are used in this Chrismon to signify that Christ is the beginning and ending of all things. This is in Revelation 1:8. these are hung on either side of the open Bible.







Serpent and the Tau Cross: The serpent reminds us of Moses' act in the wilderness to heal snakebite injuries to the people for turning away from God, as in Numbers 21:4-8.



Christmas Rose: The rose is a hardy, white rose that blooms at Christmas time. It is symbolic of messianic prophecy and the nativity.



Circle and Triangle: This Chrismon combines both forms to symbolize the eternity of the Trinity.





Bible: This Chrismon is a replica of the open Bible, which represents the Word of God.



Cup: The cup is a symbol of the blood Jesus shed on the cross for our sins. The cup also reminds us of the sacrament of Holy Communion.






Calling carolers of all ages and voices!
