

You Are Invited to Knowing God

This fall, I will teach a class on Wednesday evenings called Knowing God. It is based on the book Knowing God by J. I. Packer. Both the class and the book are about ... knowing God. Not just knowing about God, although that is part of it. But knowing God in a personal and meaningful way. As the foreword says, "The knowledge of God does not sit idly in the mind, but is living and active, and insists upon a personal response."



I hope you will invest a little time and effort into deepening your relationship with God. Each week, you will read a couple of chapters. During the class, I will talk about the topics covered in the chapters. We want to have fun and grow in knowledge and love of God.

Who is this class for?

Anyone who wants to know God. If you don't have a strong church background and knowledge of the Bible, you need this class! You will learn important truths that will help you follow Jesus and see the world in a biblical way. You will be challenged and encouraged to live your faith. At the same time, if you have a solid grasp of theology and the Bible, you will find this class enjoyable and meaningful.

Our church is all about making spiritually mature, resilient, fruitful disciples. That means (1) introducing people to Jesus, (2) helping newer and younger Christians grow in their faith, (3) helping experienced Christians grow in their faith, and (4) training leaders. This class covers all four steps but especially 2 and 3.

Why this book?

I think it speaks to the needs of our church and community: solid, biblical teaching that you can live. It speaks to the head and heart. Plus, this book has changed countless lives. It has sold over two million copies and has been translated into over 20 languages. Many church leaders today say that God used this book to answer their questions and set the direction for their lives. And, I have found it meaningful to me.

Is the book hard?

InterVarsity has used this book with college students for a long time, and it is a bestseller. Of course, God is a deep subject, but Packer presents ideas clearly. He is eloquent and sophisticated, but he puts the cookies on a reasonably low shelf.

When and where is the class?

Wednesday evenings at 6:00 p.m. in Lower Langill, from September 6 until November 15. Each class will last about an hour, but on five occasions, we will add an optional small group Bible study. (See schedule on next page.) After the class on those nights, we will break into smaller groups and study passages of scripture related to the topics of the class.

Will it be livestreamed?

Yes! Thanks to the generosity of an anonymous donor, we have completely upgraded our audio-visual and computer capabilities in lower Langill Hall. Each class

How much is the book?

The book is available through the church office for a suggested donation of \$12. We will be using the edition from InterVarsity's Signature Classics Collection (ISBN: 0830848614). Other editions are available. Crossway has published a lovely hardcover.


The Calling of a Shepherd

You can then send the appropriate type of card. The church provides all the cards for this ministry. You are not required to make home visits or phone calls unless you want to. This is a ministry you can do from home.

House of Hope

Last year, House of Hope distributed over 500,000 pounds of fresh produce through our client-choice pantries and food bank partners. To improve the

safety and efficiency of the cleaning, packing, and storage of this produce, we have constructed a 3,080square-foot packing house at our Growing Hope Production Farm in Palm City. This facility has commercial-grade equipment to rinse, dry, bag, weigh, and label hundreds of packages daily, including all of the produce that we grow, glean, and receive through generous donations. For environmental efficiencies, the water used in the process is reclaimed, filtered, and used to water the orchard or greenhouse plants at the farm. The packing house will also be available to local growers on a "Pack and Pay" basis, providing them a resource in the community to clean and package their products for sale, increasing profits and helping to keep local agriculture viable and successful. In return, they will either pay a reasonable fee to House of Hope or share some of their products. We anticipate that the packing house will benefit House of Hope and those we serve with an improved

shelf life for distributed produce. This will increase the high-quality, nutritious foods available for clients and partners, which in turn, improves overall household health and chances for financial stability. Our ability to accept, process, and store large volume produce donations will increase, and our existing educational and paid agricultural internship programs will expand to include training in the packing house.

go.build.love by Alex Squires



The go.build.love ("GBL") [mission] was established in 2017 to address the need of poor communities around the world that do not have a sustainable fresh water supply, a basic need for life!

GBL has been involved in many parts of the globe, but the greatest focus has been on Haiti and the Dominican Republic ("DR"). As part of the distribution and training for the water filter systems, GBL



also includes messages from the Bible to reach out to the people of these countries. The economic and political climates in Haiti have been

particularly dire for quite some time, making the job of providing clean water even more difficult, but GBL persists nonetheless.

GBL's core service is the provision of a passive filtering system that turns the dirty water these communities use into clean and safe water for drinking and cooking. The basic systems consist of a five-gallon bucket and a gravity-fed filter that cleans the water as it is used. These filters are assigned to families with a need, and each one has a bar code that assists GBL in monitoring and maintaining the filter systems (GBL uses local on-site residents as "point-persons" to help keep the systems working). While very simple, these systems are well received and have had a significant impact in reducing sickness and disease related to dirty water.

PCPC began supporting GBL in 2022 and has continued that support in 2023 based on the work they are doing. All total, GBL has provided 6,500 filtering systems and has conducted 11,000 follow-ups to ensure the continued operation of these systems. GBL has also built eight buildings in various locations, which are typically multi-purpose, serving as schools, churches, and general meeting locations. GBL's efforts have been successful in bringing 1,300 people to Jesus. They are also building a discipleship network which is helping to spread the Good News to many throughout the island. GBL is very appreciative of the support being received from PCPC!

Team Expansion has missionaries serving in North Africa among Muslims that PCPC

supports. They have been actively working to share the Good News about Jesus with people in the region. The Lord has blessed the ministry, and many people have given their lives to Christ and begun to worship in small house churches. In their context, it is illegal to gather as a church, and Christians are often persecuted for their faith. In spite of this, the number of Christians and churches continues to grow. This past month four people made the decision to follow Christ even though it may cost them everything. Please pray for them as they begin to live out their faith in the



MISSION ACCOMPLISHED: PUERTO RICO MISSION TRIP RECAP

What an adventure! Our longest mission trip to date—12 days—but time flew by. It was great to partner with Second Union Church in San Juan to support them in reaching the community with the gospel through their VBS. Our crew jumped right in and assisted in leading the main sessions, including dancing and acting out skits. We also decorated the entire church, led recreation, arts and crafts, and due to unexpected circumstances, our own Brian and Bernadette took over feeding the whole camp and its volunteers daily. We were also able to help with some maintenance, painting, and pressure washing around Second Union.



Word got out that a mission team from the "mainland" was in town, so in the afternoons we were able to head over to another local church and help paint and pressure wash a lot of their campus, as well. That is where we met "Sister" Esther, a missionary in Puerto Rico, who joined the mission field after an initial 2-week short-term mission trip (much like our own). After 57 years, Esther leads a prison ministry in which she corresponds with inmates to guide them in furthering their education of scripture (90 courses worth).

Our eyes were opened to several different ways people outside of our context are serving God, and our team was stretched a bit when they were asked to lead the services at Second Union two weeks in a row; reading scripture, singing in the choir, playing the piano for the offertory, leading the prayers and being liturgist. It was awesome to see our youth serve in another church's VBS and watch them lead in worship services, which is everything you can hope for.











This mission trip was an amazing adventure that will never be forgotten by any of those who participated. I thank each of them for their dedication and faithfulness to remain focused on the mission, even in adverse or uncomfortable conditions. I thank the families and members of PCPC and our community who supported us with their generosity and prayers. No mission trip ever finds success without God and a sending community's support. I thank God for the mission team members, those He put before us, and our church family, and His love and graciousness to use us to do what He could have done so easily on His own. Thank you, God, for letting us partner with You on Your mission.

SUN UP/SUN DOWN

We had another successful Sun Up/Sun Down this year. Once again, we crossed the state, watching the sun rise in Stuart and set in the Gulf from Caspersen Beach, the shark tooth capital of the world. 
