Shepherds Wanted!

We need your help! We are retooling our Shepherd Program. What is our Shepherd Program? Each member of the congregation is assigned a shepherd. Each shepherd has 10-20 people. The shepherds pray for people and send cards. Birthday cards. Anniversary cards. Etc. You should know who your shepherd is. If you don't, we are a little backed up on assigning new members. Also, we are short a few shepherds!

Enid Tatje started the Shepherd Program 41 years ago, and she led the program until 15 years ago when Susan Rosseau took over. Susan has been the coordinator since then. Susan is now ready to pass the baton, and we are looking for a new coordinator. The coordinator recruits and trains shepherds, assigns new members to flocks, and generally keeps things running smoothly.

From the beginning, the flocks have been organized geographically. For example, there is a flock for Sandhill Cove, a flock for Piper's Landing, and so on. This is one of the things we are changing. When everyone attended the same worship service (because we only had one), it made sense to organize geographically. Now, we want to organize primarily by worship service. Ideally, each shepherd would attend the same service as the people in their flock.

What will our shepherds do? We are also changing the job responsibilities of the shepherds.

- 1. pray for the people in their flock.
- 2. send cards.
- 3. notice when people in their flock begin to miss worship services.

This last duty is one reason to organize by worship services. We hope our shepherds will notice when someone's attendance pattern begins to change. Maybe that person has a need. The shepherd can reach out to let us know.

If you are a shepherd or if you are interested in learning more about becoming a shepherd, we will have a meeting to organize on **Saturday**, **April 6**, **at 9:30 a.m.** in lower Langill Hall. Hope to see you there!

Each year, on Thanksgiving Day, PCPC hosts a 5K run/walk known as the Turkey Trot. Over 600 runners participate. It is a great way for us to connect with our community. People visit our campus. Our name gets out there. More importantly, we raise money for a local mission partner that feeds the hungry in our community. Last year's recipient was LAHIA. We gave them \$16,500.

As you might expect, such a large endeavor requires a lot of planning and work. This is done by our Turkey Trot team. For the first 11 years of the Turkey Trot, Rob Johnson led the team. He perfected a system and set a high standard. Two years ago, Kelly Tullidge led the team, and last year, Karla Merrell led it. We have enjoyed tremendous success each year.

We are now looking for a team leader, and we are rebuilding the team. Some of those who served in the past will serve again. We need some fresh faces, though.

We do not yet have a date and time for the organizational meeting. But watch for it! And consider if you have the time and ability to help the team. The system is in place. It just needs energetic execution.

We want the Turkey Trot to continue. It is good for our church and our community. Will you help us keep it going strong?











Cooling with Calvin


FCA's mission is to lead every coach and athlete into a growing relationship

- community, league, and sports-specific huddles doubled in 2022.
- over 220 new Bibles were given out to student-athletes.

Dunklin Memorial Church by Nick Reynolds, Executive Director



In Jesus' first recorded sermon, Dunklin he entered into his local synagogue and was handed the scroll

to read. He turned to what is now Isaiah 61:1, which reads, "The Spirit of the Sovereign LORD is on me, because the LORD has anointed me to proclaim good news to the poor. He has sent me to bind up the brokenhearted, to proclaim freedom for the captives and release from darkness for the prisoners..."

This verse comes to life daily at Dunklin Memorial Church. Men coming from addiction and bondage are introduced to the person of Jesus Christ. They are brought from places of darkness and delivered to a "city of refuge" where they are given the most precious opportunity to come into a loving relationship with Christ. They hear the good news, their hearts are healed, and they are brought into the Kingdom of light and life. Where there was captivity and bondage, there is now truth and freedom.

We have been blessed with the privilege of ministering to drug addicts and alcoholics since 1962. The men, their marriages, and their families are all impacted as the Lord lovingly works His way into the

hearts and lives of these broken men; they are rescued, redeemed, and restored by Him.

We would like to thank Palm City Presbyterian for partnering with us over the years to support this great purpose. We see this calling as a sacred privilege. Each year, we welcome approximately 150 men into our 10-month regeneration program and are able to minister the good news of Jesus Christ to them. We are overwhelmed with the support that comes in various ways through so many. You have been a tremendous blessing to us, and we are grateful. If you are ever inclined to see for yourselves what the Lord is doing in western Martin County at a place called Dunklin Memorial Church, know that you are welcome to pay us a visit in person. We would love to give you a tour and show you what He is doing.

"Tires, Two Strangers, and a T-shirt: God's Perfect Timing" by Susan Hastings, Committee Chair

One of our congregants, Nancy McMahon, called me last week. She wanted to tell me an uplifting story about something that happened to her over the Christmas holidays.

On the Saturday before Christmas, Nancy was driving across the Roosevelt Bridge when she felt something was wrong with her tires. She pulled over in a parking lot on the other side and got out to look.

"Only God, with His perfect timing, could have used tires and a T-shirt to bring the strangers together that day."

As she got her phone out to call a service company, a car pulled up next to her, and a young man got out and approached her. He told her that he knew someone who could help her and he would be happy to call them. He suggested that the company she was calling would charge her a lot more.

She noticed that he had on a T-shirt that had *Dunklin Memorial Church* on it. After he made the call, she asked him about the shirt, knowing that they were a PCPC mission partner. He told her that some years

before, when he had been what he called "a nobody, an alcoholic," he was given a gift card from Dunklin Memorial. His thought at the time was, "Why would someone give me, 'a nothing,' something like this?"

That was the beginning of his journey. He contacted Dunklin and went for a visit. At the time, he was what he thought of as worthless—a man with a girlfriend, several kids, and no future. He was taken in by Dunklin and finished their program. Now married to the woman who had been his girlfriend, they are expecting another child and want to raise their children as Christians in a Christian household. This young man is now on staff at Dunklin and has become a mentor to others who felt the same way he did before his transformation.

But wait, there is another beautiful part to this story. As the kind stranger was telling his story to Nancy and Patrick (who had come to take his mother home), another young man approached them—downcast, alone, and apprehensive. He had been listening and wanted to know more about this place called Dunklin. That young man is now a resident at Dunklin!

Only God, with His perfect timing, could have used tires and a T-shirt to bring the strangers together that day. The hand of His Spirit was definitely moving for their good and His glory!

These are stories that I love to hear! As a committee, we approve monetary grants, which we are blessed to be able to do thanks to our generous congregation. Hearing the success stories and seeing them working for the Lord in our own communities is a humbling and heartwarming experience.

(And yes, Nancy got her tires fixed!)



12th Annual Turkey Trot Raises \$16,500!



No instruments. No praise band. Just 55,000 voices, united and raised, singing this one line as praise and worship, over and over—for 20 minutes straight! Hard to imagine singing one song for this long, let alone one line, and yet when the Holy Spirit shows up, it's hard to imagine doing anything else. It was like a small glimpse of Heaven (Revelation 4:6-11).

This was one of our experiences this past month at Passion 2024, a conference for college and young adults who desire to live for the glory of Jesus and His name. We drove 11 of our young adults to Atlanta to participate in this annual conference, and we were overwhelmed by what we became part of—not







