

GLOBAL MISSIONS

Update on Pastor Nasir Minhas in Pakistan by Susan Hastings

In September 2023, our Mission Committee learned of an attack by extremist mobs in Jaranwala, Pakistan. Our missionary partner, Pastor Nasir Minhas, told us this was the most severe attack against Christians in the church's history: nineteen churches and 89 Christian homes gutted by fire, with others partially destroyed. They were warned a short time before the attacks, and no one was hurt as they fled. Families were left homeless and fearful. In this poor community, there is little hope of rebuilding anytime soon.





Pastor Minhas, who was three hours away from the recent attack, reached out to PCPC for help providing necessary items for them. They feared that winter was coming, and many were homeless with no warm clothing. The committee voted unanimously to send funds for this emergency. Pastor Minhas purchased a large number of jumpers (what we call sweaters). In October, he delivered them to children in Jaranwala (see photos above). He asks for prayer as the Christian community recovers from this attack. This area continues to experience political instability and very high inflation, as well as difficulties and disturbing news daily.

United Servants Abroad Update from Tom and Rita Hough, missionaries



Our biggest highlight throughout the year is

the CCB (our Bible training center) graduation every November. After 32 years and 27 graduations, the excitement only grows! The faculty and staff encountered challenges with this class. Yet, they stayed the course, and each cycle brought another level of learning. The theology teachers work especially hard so that each student develops a strong understanding of the biblical doctrines. The result is 13 graduate leaders and teachers joining many other graduates who are reaching out to many villages and tribal groups in the upper Amazon Valley basin. There are now 419 CCB graduates from 13 different tribes, with students from 21 ethnic groups who have studied at CCB.

A graduate retreat for past CCB graduates was held the week after graduation. Many of these graduates had not seen their classmates in years. There were more memory-making moments with the seminars and late nights of laughter, crying, sharing, and praying. A special bond and shared passion for Jesus unites these graduates. Approximately 90% of the graduates are steadfast in their commitment to the Lord!

We are back together as a family and are doing so well. We are taking advantage of the sweet time the Lord has provided us with overwhelming gratitude cultivated during our time apart in a difficult season. Nothing is

wasted in the Kingdom of God! God's grace through your love, prayers, and support sustained us during this season. To you who supported us financially, reached out personally, and shared our situation with prayer chains around the world, we are so humbled and grateful. Some even petitioned the United States Embassy on our behalf! Thank you! What a beautiful picture of the body of Christ and just how that looks and operates during a crisis. You know who you are; you are just as much a part of this labor to the "ends of the earth" as we are!

Where are we now?

We have decided to stay in Texas at Molly's sister's place while our "Mission Schoolie" (our converted school bus/RV and home in the States) is being fixed. Incredibly, the Lord has placed it on the hearts of our

friends at Memorial Baptist Church of Taylor to fund the required repairs on our home completely. Our schoolie is being repaired in Kansas, where we broke down.

Where are we going? We hope and pray to have the bus up and running around the be-



ginning of the year and drive it back to Florida. Our goal is to stay at our home away from home, Dunklin Memorial Church, with the hopes of attending the leadership conference and homecoming celebration in February. Dunklin is where our family was restored, and the vision for the children's home in Africa was nurtured and developed.



Lord willing, while in Florida, we will schedule a Mangold Missions board meeting. We are looking forward to seeing the incredible team God put together to govern the ministry, which includes our friends at Cornerstone Builders. This amazing, kingdomminded, Christ-centered company has provided most of the physical building and project in Africa; the beacon of hope and love in the region for orphaned children, widows, and the lost, which is "Isaac's House!"

I look forward to sharing all we have learned, and all God has forged from this last season. It was a victorious battle over darkness in the region and so much more. From my perspective, at times, it was a lonely, painful, refining, and pruning period, which produced sweet, absolute reliance on the Lord! One battle that was not advertised on social media was my battle with malaria towards the end of the trip. At times, some of the sweetest assurance and knowledge of the Lord's presence in the situation was simply God's choice to allow me to live and continue the work in the area. I'm doing much better, grateful for all the prayers, and recovering well with my appetite and weight slowly returning.

With all that our family has gained in wisdom through experience and trial and error, we still recognize that this is much bigger than our family, so we are eager to get back to work. What the enemy has meant for evil, God has used for His glory. We recognize that this ordeal has possibly gained us entrance to bring the gospel into previously unreachable areas. The testimony has attracted willing supporters who might not have heard about the work in the area before.

We look forward to housing and greeting interested volunteers as early as this spring. We've had interested parties contact us, and who are even now raising their own finances, to join us and experience all that God is doing in the area.

We are not looking at this past situation as a stumbling block but more as a catapult to guide and push us in the right direction. Let us not cower back but power forward in the move to see the gospel spread throughout the Earth!

You, our dearest family and friends, are spearheading the gospel movement around the world through simple obedience to His Word and helping to care for orphaned children and widows in the region. We love you, and God willing, we will get to see and greet you on this, our time stateside, before returning to continue the good work God has started.

Last year, 4Cs served over 4,000 children, so you can see this is an impactful organization that can use our help.

We took a carload of clothing to the Gertrude Walden Child Care Center, and the staff was so appreciative. They were preparing gift bags for all the children and said our clothing would be added to those gifts since many of the children have very little for Christmas. 


